# Programs offered:


#### **Teacher Certification**

In the Teacher Certification program, students complete 27 hours of professional education courses and a field-based practicum in addition to 24 hours of content courses in their chosen teaching field.

# Undergraduate 5-year Master of Arts in Teaching

Rice University's 5-year Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) is a 36-hour degree program that affords the opportunity for motivated undergraduate students to earn graduate credit toward their MAT while simultaneously completing their bachelor's degree in the subject(s) they plan to teach. The bachelor's degree is conferred upon completion of undergraduate studies and the MAT is awarded one year later after completion of a teaching internship as a full-time, salaried teacher.
