What's Happening?

Florida finishes a five-match road stretch with a Southeastern Conference match-up. The Gators continues Southeastern Conference action at Arkansas on Friday, Sept. 16. Match time is set for 8 p.m. ET at Razorback Field. Arkansas debuted at No. 25 in the third NSCAA poll but now is the top team outside the top 25 receiving votes on the week No. 4 poll.

Both teams opened SEC play with road wins. The Gators took a 2-1 double overtime win at Kentucky to open SEC play. All the scoring in regulation came in the final seven minutes off of corner kicks. Florida struck first when **Gabby Seiler** took a shot in the 84th minute off a **Mayra Pelayo** corner kick. That shot hit **Savannah Jordan's** shoulder and kicked off into the goal. Kentucky knotted the score in the 89th minute when Zoe Swift put in a ball that popped free off as players fought for control in the box. Florida moved into overtime for the third time in half of its 2016 matches. The golden goal came when Seiler's pass found Jordan in the box. Jordan sent the ball back to the top of the 18 to **Meggie Dougherty Howard**, who placed it from 14-yards in the 103^{rd} minute.

Today's match is the final of a five-match road stretch for the Gators. Before the UF-FSU cancellation on Sept. 2, the road stretch was to be six matches, equaling the longest stretch in the program's history (also six straight road matches in 1999, 2002, 2014). During this now five-match road swing, the Gators will travel more than 11,400 miles.

When the two teams met in 2015 for UF's regular-season finale, the Gators took a 4-0 win. After a scoreless opening half, the Gators scored just 57 seconds into the second half off a **Brooke Sharp** goal. Jordan scored the second and final goals. The third goal started when goalkeeper **Kaylan Marckese** threw a long ball out to **Briana Solis** to start a counterattack. Solis took the ball down the field to score her first collegiate goal from eight yards.

Already this season, Jordan has moved to the top three on two UF career charts. Her 71 goals advances her into a tie for second with **Andi Sellers** on Florida's career goals chart. After the fifth match of the season, she moved into sole possession of third on the career points chart (her total now stands at 167).

The 2016 Gator team is made up of 39 players, making it the largest team in the program's 22-year history (previous high: 37 in 2010). Among the roster are 16 newcomers, including 13 freshmen, which is the program's fourth largest. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward **Savannah Jordan** also is a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior **Meggie Dougherty Howard** was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior **Gabby Seiler** was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

Arkansas has opened the season with 7-1 record and is receiving votes in the latest NSCAA poll after debuting at No. 25 in last week's poll. Florida will be the second top-10 team Arkansas has faced in 2016 as Arkansas opened home action on Aug. 26 with an impressive 2-1 victory over then No. 2 Duke. The Razorbacks have turned in multiple goals in every match except its latest win (1-0 vs North Texas) and one loss (1-0 at George Washington on Sept. 4). Two freshmen are making a big impact for Arkansas in 2016 as Kayla McKeon leads Arkansas with six goals and 13 points and Stefani Doyle, who has collected multiple weekly SEC honors, is second with four goals and 10 points.

What's Next?

Florida comes off a five-match road stretch to begin a three-match home stand. Home action begins Sunday, Sept. 18 versus UCF (5-3, 0-0 American Athletic). Match time is set for 7 p.m. ET at the James G. Pressly Stadium.

Last year, Florida took a 2-0 win when the two teams met in Orlando for the 2015 season opener for both programs. The two teams have faced one common opponent in 2016. UCF took a 3-2 OT win at Oklahoma State and two days later, Florida claimed a 7-2 in Stillwater, Okla.

About the 2016 Gators

The 2016 Gator team is made up 39 players – an all-time high in the programs 22-year history. Among the 16 newcomers are 13 freshmen, which is the fourth-largest for the program. Florida returns eight starters from the 2015 team that swept the Southeastern Conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Three on the 2016 Florida team have earned All-SEC honors. Three-time All-American forward Savannah Jordan is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior Meggie Dougherty Howard was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior Gabby Seiler was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She transferred to UF after the 2014 season and sat out last season due to SEC transfer rules.

- Fourteen of the 17 Gators who earned points in 2015 return this season. Of the 178 points generated by the 2015 Gators, graduation claimed three players who contributed 24 points and three goals Christen Westphal (3 goals, 13 assists 19 points), Lauren Smith (3 a 3 pts) and Claire Falknor (1 a 1 pt).
- Jordan has led not only the Gators in goals and points the last three years, she's also ranked among the SEC and NCAA leaders. In the final 2015 NCAA stats, Jordan ranked No. 2 in goals (24) and points (55). Her three-year career total of 65 goals equals Gator Great <u>Abby Wambach's</u> freshman, sophomore and junior total.
- Dougherty Howard shared the Washington Spirit Reserves goals lead (5) in this summer's action. The team won the 2016 Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) East title. Sophomore Melanie Monteagudo (FC Surge) also led her team in goals (6). Other current Gators in 2016 WPSL action this summer included Nelson (Washington Spirit Reserves), Seiler, Brooke Sharp and Sarah Troccoli (Florida SOL FC) and Briana Solis (Florida Krush).
- Gators were busy in the off season with various national team activities. A total
 of seven returning Gators were called into U.S. Age-Group National Team or
 tournaments since the conclusion of last season. Sophomore Gaby Rivera also
 was called into Mexico Under-20 National Team events.
- Three join Florida as transfers (Erika Nelson/Maryland; Parker Roberts/Kansas; Gabby Seiler/Georgia) with Nelson and Seiler competing for the Gators in 2016.

Thirteen freshmen join the Gators in 2016

The 13 freshmen make up the fourth-largest class ever for UF. It is the second consecutive year Florida has brought in a large class, as the 2015 class of 15 was the third largest in the program's history.

- Sammie Betters, Julia Lester and current sophomore Gator goalkeeper Kaylan Marckese teamed up on the Tampa Bay United 97 Premier to win the 2015 <u>US Youth Soccer National U-17 Championship in Tulsa, Okla.</u>, last summer. Lester joined Marckese on the tournament's <u>Best XI team</u>.
- Tess Sapone is the <u>2016 Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year</u>. Lester is a 2016 NSCAA High School All-American.
- Among the 13 freshman are a pair Alyssa Baumbick and Susi Espinoza who have been called into U.S. age-group national camps over their careers.
 Baumbick attended several U.S. Youth Team camps, including each of the four Under-19 camps held in 2015. Espinoza was part of U.S. U14 Girls National Team in 2012 and part of 2013 U.S. U15 player pool.
- All have extensive playing resumes in Elite Clubs Soccer League (ECNL), Olympic Development Program or US Youth Soccer competition.
- Two graduated from high school early to join the Gators. Hope Hyde of Dallas, Texas, and Jocelyn Nelson of Barnsdall, Okla., each finished their high school studies in December 2015, allowing them to enroll at the University of Florida for the spring 2016 semester.
- Two graduated at the top of their high school classes and are enrolled in University of Florida Honors classes - Sammie Betters and Danielle Van Liere.

The University of Florida is picked to defend its Southeastern Conference title in the 2016 league coaches' preseason vote.

The Gators received 165 points that included 10 first-place votes, topping Texas A&M's 154 points (four first-place votes).

Florida swept SEC regular-season and tournament titles in 2015. The Gators took their 14th SEC title with an 8-2-1 record and claimed the program's 11th SEC Tournament title with a 2-1 win over Texas A&M in the final.

Three Gators have earned All-SEC honors during their careers. Three-time All-American forward <u>Savannah Jordan</u> is also a three-time All-SEC first-team selection and has twice been named the SEC Offensive Player of the Year (2013, 2015). Fellow senior <u>Meggie Dougherty Howard</u> was a 2015 All-SEC second team selection at midfield. In addition, redshirt junior <u>Gabby Seiler</u> was a 2014 All-SEC first-team selection while with Georgia. She sat out 2015 action due to SEC transfer rules.

Seven Goal Half Sets Florida Record

After a scoreless opening half at Oklahoma State on Sept. 4, the Gators got their first goal in the 48th minute. That goal from sophomore Melanie Monteagudo was the first of seven for Florida, as the Gators took a 7-2 win.

It was the first time that Florida scored seven in a half in the program's 22-year history. Eight times, Florida has scored six goals in a half, with the last coming in an Oct. 26, 2001 home win versus Mississippi State (6-0). Only once has Florida scored six goals on the road and that was a 7-2 win at No. 20 Maryland on Oct. 21, 1998.

Florida last scored seven goals in a match in a 7-2 win at Kansas on Sept. 18, 2011. The Gators have turned in seven or more goals in a match 19 times in the program's history.

Burleigh Career Wins Total Among Nation's Best

Becky Burleigh stands among the nation's top three active coaches for wins and winning percentage.

She enters the 2016 season with a 26-year record of 455-121-37 (0.772). She stands at No. 3 in both wins (455) and winning percentage (0.772) among the NCAA Division I Active Coaches.

She is the only woman among the top five on either chart.

Smart Gators

The University of Florida soccer program posted a 3.39 grade point average for the 2014-15 academic year, earning the squad a spot in the 2015 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award. Programs with a 3.0 or better GPA are named to the annual list.

One Gator has found academic perfection. Senior Betsy Middleton has earned nothing less than an "A" throughout her academic career. She is pursuing a degree in psychology – behavioral & cognitive neuroscience.

She was joined on the 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-America second team by teammate Savannah Jordan, who also earned 2015 NSCAA Scholar All-America honors.

At the Aug. 28 4-3 overtime win at then No. 15 UCLA, it was an own goal in the 96th minute that gave Florida the win. Of Florida's 39 golden goals up to that point, it was the first own goal to give UF the win.

For the Southeastern Conference opener at Kentucky on Sept. 8, senior Meggie Dougherty Howard hit the winner in the 103rd minute. It was the first golden goal of her soccer career – college, club and high school.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The 2016 season opened for the University of Florida soccer team with a 5-2 win over Iowa State Friday evening in front of a James G. Pressly Stadium crowd of 1,293.

Gators' 2016 scoring started with a give-and-go play. Sophomore Mayra Pelayo sent the ball to Savannah Jordan, who was standing with back to goal at top of the 18-yard box. Pelayo continued her run into the box, receiving the ball back off a one-touch from Jordan. She moved deeper in the box before sending a curling 10yard shot which scored at the upper far post corner.

Florida's second goal came shortly before halftime. Senior Betsy Middleton received the ball off a throw-in at the top of the Cyclones final defensive third. She sent the ball across to sophomore Melanie Monteagudo located just above the far side of the 18-yard box. She took a touch, looked up and launched a left-footed 22-yard shot that just went under the crossbar to score in the $42^{\rm nd}$ minute. It was her first goal as a Gator.

Two goals in less than two minutes pushed the Gators lead out to 4-0 early in the second half. Gabby Seiler sent the ball to Jordan, who was just inside the top of the Cyclone box. She immediately touched the ball back to just above the box to find sophomore Sarah Troccoli. The 20-yard shot off Troccoli's left foot dipped under the crossbar to score in the 48th minute.

A pair of senior combined to score the next Gator goal in the 49th minute. Pelayo passed the ball to Jordan in the middle of the ISU box. Jordan took a touch toward top of the 18-yard box and then sent it to Dougherty Howard, who had moved to just above the box. Dougherty Howard took a touch toward goal before scoring on

The Cyclones closed the lead to two after scoring twice within a 10-minute span. Senior Koree Willer scored ISU's first goal of the season at 53:58 off an assist from Mia McAleer. Then Klasey Medelberg scored off a 26yard shot in the 63rd minute.

Jordan scored on an unassisted goal from eight yards in the 68th minute to give the Gators the final margin. That goal was No. 66 of her career, moving her into a tie for third on the Gators career goal list with Danielle Fotopoulos. She also moved up one spot to a tie for fifth with Sarah Yohe on UF's Career Points list at 153.

Worth Noting

- Pelayo also scored the Gators' first goal in the 2015 opener at UCF. She used her left foot to score her first collegiate goal in the 32nd minute off a 22-yard shot.

 Jordan has scored a goal in each of her four season-opening matches. Her career total of 66
- goals is the most among the nation's current players.
- Tonight is the 12th time a Gator has recorded three or more assists in a match. Jordan is the first with three assists since Annie Speese's trio versus Florida Gulf Coast on Sept. 11, 2011.
- This is the first time since the 2001 season that Florida has recorded 30 shots in a match
- This is the most goals for the Gators in an opening match since Florida's 5-2 win over Utah in 2001
- Florida's starting lineup included one true freshmen Julia Lester. At least one Gator freshman has started 17 of the program's 22 season openers. Also among the starting Gators are two other newcomers. Erika Nelson transferred from Maryland and will play her redshirt senior year at UF. Gabby Seiler joined Florida in the fall of 2015 after playing her first two seasons at Georgia. She sat out the 2015 season due to Southeastern Conference transfer rules.

The Gators were awarded their first penalty kick of the season when Monteagudo was upended by FAU's Alex Mason. Senior Meggie Dougherty Howard successfully converted the penalty kick in the 29th minute

Florida's final goal came with just a second left in the opening half. Jordan received the ball after making a run down the right side and she moved toward goal. FAU goalkeeper Sydney Drinkwater came out to make the stop and the two collided in the box. Drinkwater was given a red card and Jennifer Ocampo replaced her in goal. She deflected Jordan's penalty kick attempt, but Jordan put in the rebound to give UF a 3-0 halftime lead.

STILLWATER, Okla. - Goals were aplenty Sunday afternoon as the University of Florida soccer team put in seven goals to take a 7-2 win over Oklahoma State at the Cowboy Soccer Complex.

It was a tale of two halves. After a scoreless opening half, sophomore Melanie Monteagudo put in her first goal of the day in the 48th minute. Just under five minutes later, senior All-American Savannah Jordan used a 20-yard shot to score her first goal of the day. Less than three minutes later, Monteagudo put in a ball mishandled by the OSU goalkeeper to put the Gators up 3-0 after an eight-minute scoring flurry.

OSU Courtney Dike scored at 63:06, but Gator freshman Kit Loferski scored her first collegiate goal just 50 seconds later to push the lead back out to three goals

Jordan scored her second goal of the day in the 68th minute. That goal was the 71st of her collegiate career, moving her into a tie with Andi Sellers (1997-01) for second on the Gators Career Goals Chart.

Another Cowgirl goal, this time from Haley Woodard, finished the OSU scoring in the 79th minute. OSU's Elise Hawn received a red card at 79:11, forcing the Cowgirls to play the final 10 minutes a man down

Sophomore Mayra Pelayo scored the final two goals of the match. Her first goal in the 80th minute was a 19yard free kick awarded on the red card and then she hit an angled shot in the 88th minute.

- Seven goals in a half is a first in the 22-year history of the Gator program. Eight times, Florida has scored six goals in a half, with the last coming in an Oct. 26, 2001 home win versus Mississippi State (6-0). Only once has Florida scored six goals on the road and that was a 7-2 win at No. 20 Maryland on Oct. 21, 1998.
- Three Gators turned in a pair of goals Sunday Monteagudo, Jordan and Pelayo. It was the first multiple goal matches of Monteagudo and Pelayo's collegiate careers, Jordan has turned in multi-goal matches 18 times as a Gator.
- Jordan's two goals and two assists Sunday moved her into sole possession of third on the Gators Career Points Chart at 166 (71 goals, 24 assists). She is also tied for second on the Gator Career Goals Chart at 71. The Gators' career leader for goals and points is Abby Wambach (1998-01, 96 goals, 242 points).
- Today's match is the third of a five match road stretch for Florida. The Gators were to play at No. 1 Florida State Friday, but Hurricane Hermine's impact on the Tallahassee area caused the match to be canceled

LEXINGTON, Ky. - The start of Southeastern Conference play couldn't be contained in just 90 minutes for the University of Florida soccer team. It was the third overtime for the Gators this season and Thursday's final result was a 2-1 double overtime win in front of 1.269 at the Wendell & Vickie Bell Soccer Complex

Of the last nine meetings between these two teams, four have gone to overtime, as the Gators are 3-0-1 in that span. It was Florida's fifth overtime match to open league play in the program's 22-year history and first since taking a 2-1 OT win versus Kentucky in 2009.

How the Match Unfolded:

All the scoring in regulation came in the final eight minutes, with each starting off a corner kick. Gators struck first at 83:56 when a corner kick from Mayra Pelayo found Gabby Seiler at the top of the box. Seiler's shot deflected off senior All-American Savannah Jordan's shoulder and scored in the upper left corner. It was Seiler's first goal of her Gator career.

But the Wildcats knotted up the score at 88:26. The ball off a corner kick pinged around the box, then popped free on the left side. Zoe Swift pounced on the loose ball and placed it in from five yards.

The match moved to overtime – the third for UF this season and Kentucky's second. The golden goal included two that played a role in UF's first goal, as Seiler sent the ball to Jordan who was in the middle of the box, back to goal. Jordan's diagonal pass slid between two defenders to find Meggie Dougherty Howard near the top of the box. Dougherty Howard's right-footed angled shot from 14 yards scored in the far corner at 102:44.

Worth Noting

- Dougherty Howard's goal at 102:44 is the 15th latest goal to win in Florida's history. It was her third goal of the season, which equals her collegiate season high set in 2015.
- Seiler's goal is her first of her Gator career. Seiler transferred to Florida in 2015 after spending
- her first two seasons at Georgia. She sat out the 2015 season due to SEC transfer rules. This is the eighth time in Florida's 22-year history it has opened league play against Kentucky and is 7-1 in those matches.
- The Gators recorded a season-high 31 shots Thursday. UK goalkeeper Evangeline Soucie recorded a career-high 11 saves.
- Florida is 2-1 in overtime matches this season (1-0 OT loss at No. 3 Stanford and 4-3 OT win at No. 15 UCLA).

We knew we had time in the overtime and had faith we were going to get it done. It was good resiliency by our team not to give into to panicking or playing rushed.
