THE STORYLINE

- Florida forced four turnovers in a 45-7 win in its SEC opener against Kentucky last Saturday. The outcome marked the 30th consecutive win for the Gators in the series, which is the longest such active run by one FBS program over another. With the win, the Gators are now 2-0 for the 11th time in the last 12 seasons.
- Defensively, UF's 14 points allowed this season are the fewest it's surrendered in its first two games of a season since 2011. In addition, the Gators have held consecutive opponents to less than 200 total yards for the first time since 2009.
- Florida is the only team in the country ranked in the top 20 in scoring defense (t-6th), rushing defense (17th), passing defense (6th), total defense (2nd), sacks (t-3rd), interceptions (t-16th), and opponent third down percentage (15th).
- Florida's defense recorded three interceptions and held Kentucky to less than 60 yards passing, which is just the ninth time since 1996 that's been done by an SEC team.
- Offensively, Florida racked up 564 total yards against the Wildcats, which was its highest mark in an SEC game since the Gators totaled 571 total yards against Vanderbilt on Nov. 3, 2001.
- UF's 45 points were the most in an SEC game since the Orange and Blue scored 48 against Kentucky on Sep. 24, 2011. In addition, Florida's 14 third down conversions were its highest single-game total since at least 1996.
- Florida converted 14 of its 20 third downs against Kentucky, becoming the only SEC team since 1996 to convert at least 70 percent of its third downs when it faced at least 20 of them in a game.
- Florida is one of nine teams in the country and the only team in the SEC to post 225-plus rushing yards and 300-plus passing yards in a game against an FBS opponent this season.
- Against UK, Luke Del Rio became the first UF quarterback since Rex Grossman against LSU in 2001 to hit 300 yards and four TDs passing against a league opponent. Del Rio also became the first UF quarterback since Tim Tebow (2007) to throw for 250-plus yards and complete 55 percent of his passes in consecutive games.
- Antonio Callaway and Brandon Powell are one of five receiver tandems in the country with at least 115 receiving yards and two receiving touchdowns apiece.
- Lamical Perine, who carried the ball 17 times for 105 yards against UK, became the 21st freshman (redshirt or true) to rush for 100 yards in a game since 1955. The Theodore, Ala. native became the 16th true freshman to rush for 100 yards and the first since Jeff Demps in 2008.
- After an impressive week one against UMass where kicker Eddy Pineiro made three field goals of 40-plus yards, the redshirt sophomore connected on a 54-yard attempt against Kentucky last Saturday. That field goal was the longest by a Gator since Caleb Sturgis (Nov. 19, 2011 against Furman) made a 55-yarder.
- Moving on to the third week of the season, UF hosts North Texas in The Swamp at 7:30 PM on Saturday. UNT enters the game 1-1 and fresh off a 41-20 win against Bethune-Cookman.
- Saturday's game represents the second-ever meeting between Florida and North Texas, with the first coming all the way back in 1947.

LAST TIME OUT - KENTUCKY

Junior quarterback Luke Del Rio threw for 320 yards and four touchdowns and the UF defense stonewalled the Wildcats by allowing just 149 total yards — and a mere three pass completions — and forcing four turnovers in a 45-7 trouncing Saturday in the SEC opener for both teams at the "Swamp." The outcome marked the 30th consecutive win for the Gators in the series — the longest such active run by one FBS program over another — but more importantly left the crowd of 85,821 with a far better vibe than last week's lackluster 24-7 defeat of Massachusetts.

Del Rio, who hit 19 of his 32 attempts and commanded a unit that converted 14 of 20 third-down opportunities, be-

came the first UF quarterback since Rex Grossman against LSU in 2001 to hit 300 yards and four TDs passing against a league opponent. Sophomore wide receiver Antonio Callaway caught five balls for a career-high 129 yards, including a 78-yard scoring bomb. Freshman tailback Lamical Perine carried 17 times for 105 yards to lead a ground attack that went for 244 yards and helped the Gators to a total offense digit of 564.

Only a 2-yard scoring run from UK's Jojo Kemp with 4:27 remaining prevented what would have been UF's first shut-out of the Wildcats since a 38-0 blanking in 2012.

YOUNG GATORS

- Through two games, UF has played 13 true freshmen and 22 newcomers. In the season opener against UMass, 17 of the 51 players (33.3%) that saw action were making their Florida debut. In 2016, true freshmen have 16 tackles thus far.
- In 16 total games under head coach Jim McElwain, true freshmen have accomplished the following...
 - 123 total games played | 33 starts on offense/defense | 13 total touchdowns | 99 rushes for 461 yards | 51 receptions for 871 yards | 49 tackles, 9.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks
 - In 2016, Florida returned 50 letterwinners and 16 starters. UF has the third-fewest seniors in the country with 15.

QUICK HITS

- Florida entered the season ranked in the preseason AP Poll for the first time since 2013. However, UF is the lowest ranked defending SEC East champion since the conference created a championship game in 1992.
- The Gators are one of three FBS teams to hold three opponents under a 10-percent conversion rate on third down since the start of last season—San Diego State and Michigan are the only others to do so.
- Florida has the same offensive coordinator for the second year in a row, as Doug Nussmeier enters year two with the Gators. UF has had a different offensive coordinator for the past three years (2015-Nussmeier, 2014-Roper, 2013-Pease).
- Redshirt sophomore quarterback Luke Del Rio was the second transfer quarterback to start a game in program history, the first was Noah Brindise in 1997. Del Rio was a walk-on with Alabama in 2013 and saw limited action the following year in his one season at Oregon State. Brindise didn't receive any Division-I offers out of high school and accepted an athletic scholarship from Wingate University, a Division-II program in North Carolina. The Fort Myers, Fla., native returned to the Sunshine State after his freshman season and made three career starts at QB for the Gators.
- Del Rio recorded his first collegiate start against UMass and went 29-for-44 with 256 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The Santa Rosa Beach native joined Rex Grossman (2002) and Chris Leak (2005) as the only Gator quarterbacks since 1996 to complete 65 percent of his passes (min. 25 completions and 40 att.), throw two touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- Florida's last four head coaches have posted a combined 42-10 (.808) mark in their second season at the helm. Last season, Jim McElwain became the only coach in UF history to lead the Gators to the SEC Championship game in his debut season. In addition, he became Florida's first coach to win 10 games in his inaugural season.
- UF's 12-game 2016 schedule features five teams that played in a bowl last season, five that won at least 8 games (including two that had 10-plus victories) and three that were in the final AP rankings. In addition, Florida plays four teams ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 poll.
- UF has scored in 348 consecutive games, a streak that ranks third on the NCAA's all-time list, trailing only Michigan (365, 1984-04) and BYU (361, 1975-03). In addition, it's the longest active streak in the country.
- The Gators return six offensive linemen this season who have started at least one game at UF: David Sharpe (13), Cam Dillard (11), Martez Ivey (8), Antonio Riles (6) Tyler Jordan (2) and Fred Johnson (2). Last season, Florida only had one.
- Florida is one of 27 FBS teams and one of three SEC teams (Missouri, Mississippi State) to allow one or zero sacks this year.

CROSSING PATHS

- Florida has three players on its roster from the state of Texas, while UNT has one player from Florida.
- Florida head coach Jim McElwain and defensive coordinator Geoff Collins both worked with North Texas running backs coach/special teams coordinator Tommy Perry at Alabama. In 2007, Collins was director of player personnel, while Perry was in his second year as a graduate assistant. The following year, McElwain was offensive coordinator and Perry was once again a GA for the 2008 Crimson Tide, which went 12-2 and finished the year ranked sixth in the country. UF offensive line coach Mike Summers and North Texas defensive coordinator Mike Ekeler coached together at Southern California in 2013. Summers was the run game coordinator/offensive line coach, while Ekeler was linebackers coach. Ekeler also coached linebackers last season at Georgia, which lost a 27-3 decision in Jacksonville. North Texas associate head coach/pass game coordinator Tommy Mainord coached wide receivers at Kentucky last season. Meanwhile, North Texas run game coordinator/offensive line coach Brad Davis was offensive line coach for the 2015 East Carolina Pirates, who faced the Gators in The Swamp last September. North Texas head coach Sean Littrell and UF offensive coordinator Doug Nussmeier were on opposites sidelines for three shootouts between Arizona and Washington. Nussmeier, Washington's offensive coordinator, helped the Huskies to a 36-33 win in 2009 and 42-31 victory in 2011. Littrell, who was promoted from running backs/tight ends coach to offensive coordinator in his three years at Arizona (2009-11), helped the Wildcats rout Washington, 44-14, in 2010.

FLORIDA 31, TENNESSEE 0 (Knoxville, Fla.) -- For the second time in school history, the Gators traveled to Knoxville and blanked the Vols. Using a dominating defense and a near-flawless offensive attack, top-ranked Florida took down No. 15 Tennessee 31-0 in front of a stunned Volunteer crowd of 96,656 and a national ESPN audience. It remains the largest SEC road shutout in school history and UT's worst home SEC loss in school history.

WEEK 2 | MANNING AWARD STAR OF THE WEEK

Luke Del Rio, QB

- After his 320-yard, four touchdown performance to help Florida defeat SEC opponent Kentucky, Luke Del Rio was named as one of eight Manning Award Stars of the Week.
- Against UK, Luke Del Rio became the first UF quarterback since Rex Grossman against LSU in 2001 to hit 300 yards and four TDs passing against a league opponent. Del Rio also became the first UF quarterback since Tim Tebow (2007) to throw for 250-plus yards and complete 55 percent of his passes in consecutive games.

- Florida is tied for first among SEC teams and tied for 13th in the FBS with a +3 turnover margin. When winning or tying the turnover battle since 2011, the Gators are 36-9. When losing the turnover battle since 2011, UF is 4-16.

- The Gators scored 28 points off turnovers against Kentucky last week, which was the most Florida scored off turnovers since Sept. 11, 2010 against USF.
- The Gators racked up 564 total yards against Kentucky, their highest total against an SEC opponent since amassing 571 yards against Vanderbilt on Nov. 3, 2001.
- UF's 324 total yards in the first half against Kentucky was the most in any half against an SEC opponent since the Gators totaled 379 in the second half at Tennessee on Sep. 15, 2012. In addition, it was most in an opening half against an SEC opponent since UF totaled 330 yards at Vanderbilt on Nov. 8, 2008.
- Putting that number in perspective, from 2010 to 2015, Florida averaged 325.8 yards per game in their 49 games against SEC opponents.
- Florida's 45 points in its 45-7 victory over Kentucky marked its highest point total against an SEC team since its 48-10 win over Kentucky on Sep. 24, 2011.
- Florida converted 14 of its 20 third downs against Kentucky, marking just the 18th time since 1996 an FBS team converted at least 70 percent of its third downs when it faced at least 20 of them in a game.
- Florida's 14 third down conversions were the third-most by an SEC team since 1996.
- Florida has converted at least nine third downs in each of its games this year, marking the first time since 2009 (Nov. 21 & 28) and fourth time since 1996 it converted nine third downs in consecutive games.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- UF's offensive line enters its third season under **MIKE SUMMERS**, the only holdover from Will Muschamp's staff.
- The Gators started the same five offensive linemen (including returners **CAM DILLARD**, **ANTONIO RILES**, and **DAVID SHARPE**) at the same five positions in their first six games last season, marking the first time since 2008 they achieved such continuity.

RUSHING

- LAMICAL PERINE** is one of six FBS true freshmen to post a 100-yard rushing game this season. Of those six, he's one of three players (Chris Evans, Michigan; Cade Carney, Wake Forest) to do it against an FBS team.

- Perine is also the only FBS true freshman to rush for 100 yards and catch touchdown pass in a game this year.
- Perine totaled 105 yards on 17 carries against Kentucky, becoming the 16th UF true freshman since 1955 to post a 100-yard rushing game and the first UF true freshman since **Jeff Demps** (Oct. 11, 2008 vs. LSU) to post a 100-yard rushing game against an SEC opponent.

- Perine joined **Ciatrick Fason** (2004), **DeShawn Wynn** (2005), **Percy Harvin** (2006 & 2007), and **Chris Rainey** (2011) as the only Gators since 1996 to rush for 100-plus yards and catch a touchdown pass in the same game.

PASSING

- LUKE DEL RIO** is one of three quarterbacks (Patrick Mahomes II, Texas Tech; Cooper Rush, Central Michigan) to throw for 320 yards and four touchdowns against a Power Five opponent this year.
- Del Rio currently ranks second in completion percentage (63.2), tied for second in passing touchdowns (6), and third in passing yards per game (288.0) among SEC quarterbacks.
- Del Rio's 320 passing yards against Kentucky were the most by a UF quarterback in an SEC game since Chris Leak threw for 322 yards against Arkansas back on Oct. 2, 2004.
- Del Rio's efficient performances against UMass and Kentucky made him the first UF quarterback since Tim Tebow (2007) to throw for 250-plus yards and complete at least 55 percent of his passes in consecutive games.
- Del Rio's 29 completions against UMass were the most ever by a UF quarterback in a debut start, while his 44 attempts were two shy of cracking UF's single-game all-time top 10--none of which came in a debut start.
- Del Rio's performance against UMass also joined him with **Rex Grossman** (2002) and **Chris Leak** (2006) as the only other Gators since 1996 to complete 65 percent of his passes (minimum 25 completions and 40 attempts), throw two touchdowns and no interceptions.

- Del Rio's 256 passing yards against UMass were the fifth-most by a UF quarterback in a debut start since 1990, trailing **Shane Matthews** (332, 1990), **Tim Tebow** (300, 2007), **Rex Grossman** (276, 2000), and **Chris Leak** (268, 2003).

- Del Rio's 78-yard touchdown pass to **ANTONIO CALLAWAY** in UF's rout of Kentucky was its longest passing touchdown since **AHMAD FULWOOD** caught an 86-yard touchdown pass in the 2015 Birmingham Bowl.

RECEIVING

- ANTONIO CALLAWAY** and **BRANDON POWELL** are the only pair of SEC teammates with at least 115 receiving yards and two receiving touchdowns apiece this year.
- Against UMass, Callaway and Powell became just the fifth UF tandem to both catch at least seven passes, tally 70-plus yards, and score a touchdown in the same game since 1996, with the most recent occurrence coming in the 2010 Sugar Bowl.
- Callaway logged his third career game of 110+ receiving yards and a receiving touchdown in UF's rout of Kentucky, making him the only SEC receiver with three such outings in conference games over the last two seasons. Last year, Callaway was one of three true freshmen with two such games against FBS opponents.
- Callaway is one of six SEC receivers with four 100-yard receiving games against Power Five opponents over the last two seasons. Of the six, he's one of four still active.
- Last year, Callaway became the first true freshman in UF history and one of only six SEC true freshmen (Amari Cooper, Alshon Jeffery, Julio Jones, Christian Kirk, Calvin Ridley) since 2006 to post three 100-yard receiving games, including a season-best 112-yard outing (second-most by a UF true freshman) against Tennessee.
- In addition to being the only FBS player with at least 345 punt return yards and 480 receiving yards last season, Callaway joined Oklahoma's **Ryan Broyles** (2009) and Central Michigan's **Antonio Brown** (2008) as the only underclassmen since 2008 to amass 400-plus punt return yards and 675-plus receiving yards in a season.
- Callaway's 678 receiving yards last season broke UF's true freshman record, previously held by Reidel Anthony (615 yards in 1994).
- Callaway's team-high 1,211 all-purpose yards on 69 plays last year averaged out to 17.6 yards per play--which would have led the SEC and tied for 11th in the FBS in yards per play if he had one more touch to meet the minimum qualifying mark (70 touches).
- Last season, the Gators had four players with 350-plus receiving yards and 2-plus touchdowns for the first time since 2007, when **Percy Harvin**, **Andre Caldwell**, **Louis Murphy** and **Cornelius Ingram** all reached those totals.

FLORIDA'S DEFENSE

- For the second consecutive week, the Gators allowed only seven points, ranking first in the SEC in scoring defense and tying for sixth in the FBS for the season.
- Florida's 14 points allowed are the fewest it's surrendered in its first two games of a season since 2011, when UF beat FAU 41-3 and then shut out UAB 39-0.
- Florida is the only team in the country ranked in the top 20 in scoring defense (1-6th), rushing defense (17th), passing defense (6th), total defense (2nd), sacks (1-3rd), interceptions (1-16th), and opponent third down percentage (15th).
- Of those aforementioned six categories, only Florida, Miami (Fla.), and Southern Miss rank inside the top 10 nationally in at least four of them. In addition, Florida & Boston College are the only teams in the country ranked in the top 20 in scoring defense, rushing defense, and passing defense.
- The Gators improved on allowed yardage, yielding 149 total yards to Kentucky (with 45 yards coming from a sideline pass in the fourth quarter). That ranks 15th in all games since 1996 for Florida, sixth in the FBS for Week 2 and first in the SEC for Week 2.
- For the first time since 2009 (Sept. 26 at Kentucky and Oct. 10 at LSU), Florida held consecutive opponents to less than 200 total yards (UMass gained 187 yards in Week 1).
- Florida's nine allowed first downs in Week 2 was the fewest allowed by an SEC team this year and its tied with Ohio for third-fewest allowed in a single game against an FBS opponent this year (only Air Force [6 vs. Georgia State] and Boston College [8 vs. UMass]).
- In 2015, Florida opponents converted 209 total first downs (16 per game), which ranked 30th in the FBS and seventh in the SEC.
- The win over Kentucky, featuring four Wildcat turnovers, was the third time in UF's last eight SEC games that it forced at least four turnovers.
- The Gators' five sacks tied for fifth in the country and ranked first in the SEC during Week 2.
- UF totaled four-plus sacks in four SEC games last season, passing the 2012 Gators for the most times a UF team did so in a campaign since the beginning of the 2010 season.
- UF ranked second in the SEC and fifth in the country with 40 sacks in 2015, while its 294 sack yards ranked fourth nationally.
- Florida's 40 sacks in 2015 tied the 2009 Gators for the highest total since 1999 (43 sacks) and the sixth-highest total since UF began tracking the statistic in 1980. This

season, Florida is One of three teams in the country (Illinois, Houston) with three players with two-plus sacks.

- In addition, Florida has four-plus sacks in both games this season and five of its last eight contests dating back to last season.

PASS DEFENSE

- **TORRIAN GRAY**, the newest member of the Florida coaching staff, comes to UF after ten seasons at Virginia Tech. He coached the Hokies' defensive backs and will do the same at Florida. At VT, Gray's unit allowed only 185.0 passing yards per game, which ranked second in the nation.
- Florida notched three interceptions and held Kentucky to less than 60 yards passing, which is just the ninth time since 1996 that's been done by an SEC team.
- Dating back to 1996, opponents have averaged under 200 yards passing per game (192.9) against Florida, the fifth-best figure in the nation (excluding FBS newcomer Appalachian State). Since the start of the 2008 season, the Gators are tied for first among FBS teams in interception return touchdowns (21) and lead the nation in interception return yards (2,253), while ranking fifth in interceptions (139).
- For the 24th time since 2010, Florida had multiple interceptions (**MARCUS MAYE**, **TEEZ TABOR** and **QUINCY WILSON**) against an FBS opponent, which is tied for 11th-most nationally and tied with LSU for the second-most among SEC schools during that span.
- For the 13th time since 2010, Florida recorded three or more interceptions, and it's the eighth time during that span it did so against an FBS opponent.

- In UF's last 21 meetings with Kentucky, its defense has intercepted 35 passes and surrendered just 23 passing touchdowns.
- Florida limited Kentucky to just 55 passing yards, good for second-lowest in the FBS in Week 2 games (with 45 yards coming off one play).
- Without Kentucky's 45-yard pass, the 15 allowed passing yards by Florida would have ranked third-lowest in UF games since 1996 and least since the Gators gave up 12 passing yards to Ohio on Sept. 14, 2002.
- Kentucky's 21.4 completion percentage ranked Florida the lowest among SEC teams for opponent completion percentage on the season.
- Florida's 48 passing touchdowns allowed since 2012 is the fewest nationally among teams that have been FBS every season during that time frame.

RUSH DEFENSE

- Florida gave up just 94 net rushing yards against Kentucky, the fifth-best total in the SEC in Week 2.
- The Gators have allowed less than 100 yards rushing in 14 of their last 27 games going back to the start of 2014.
- Florida caused 34 rushing yards lost, the fifth-highest total in the conference during Week 2.
- Florida held five opponents under 75 rushing yards in 2015, the most times that's been done since 2006.
- In 2015, Florida's rush defense (128.07 ypg) ranked 25th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC. Opponents averaged 3.53 yards per carry against UF's rush defense, a figure that tied for 17th among FBS teams and fourth in the SEC.
- The Gators held two opponents last season (East Carolina and South Carolina) under 25 rushing yards, a feat last accomplished by the 2006 Gators, who held three teams to less than 25 rushing yards. Overall, Florida held five opponents under 75 rushing yards last year and three of those performances came in SEC play, which ranks second only to the 1997 Gators for the most times that's been done in a season since 1996.
- The -13 rushing yards that Florida allowed East Carolina last season was the fewest rushing yards the Gators have given up since 1998, when Louisiana-Monroe was held to -36 rushing yards. It's also the fifth-lowest total allowed by an FBS team, lowest total allowed by an SEC team in 2015 and fourth-lowest total allowed in UF history.
- Florida's rush defense (128.07 ypg.) ranked 25th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC in 2015. Opponents averaged 3.53 yards per carry against UF's rush defense, a figure that tied for 17th among FBS teams and fourth in the SEC.

FLORIDA'S SPECIAL TEAMS

PUNTING

- Redshirt junior **JOHNNY TOWNSEND** returned this season as the Gators' punter. In 2015, Townsend appeared in all 14 games, and tallied 83 punts for an average of 45.4 yards.

- Townsend placed 30 punts inside the 20 and has 29 boots of over 50 yards, including a career-high tying long of 61 yards against Tennessee and Michigan. His 45.4 average sits second all-time in program history (Kyle Christy - 45.8, 2012).

- Townsend's 51.8 punting average was the best mark in the 24-year history of the SEC Championship Game, and it ranks as the fourth-best average in school history for a single game (min. 7 punts).

- UF ranked third in the nation and first in the SEC in 2015 for net punting with 3,765 punt yards off of 84 punts.

RETURN GAME

- ANTONIO CALLAWAY** is back for his sophomore season after he returned 28 punts for the Gators in 2015 and averaged 15.5 yards per return with two TDs. Callaway was just the third true freshman since 2008 to total 400-plus punt return yards, average 15.54 yards per punt return, and tally two punt return touchdowns in a season. The other two were Nebraska's De'Mornay Pierson-El (2014) and North Carolina's Ryan Switzer (2013).

- Callaway's 435 punt return yards last year are the second-most ever recorded by a Gator in a single season, second only to Jacquez Green, who had 510 yards on 37 returns.

- Callaway finished the 2015 season ranked third in the FBS in punt return yards (435) and is one of 12 players in the country with at least two return TDs.

- Callaway's two punt return TDs last year tied the single-season school record that is shared by Brandon James (2008), Lito Shepard (2000), Jacquez Green (1997, 1996), Steve Tannen (1968) and Loran Broadus (1948). Of that group, Callaway is the only one to do it as a true freshman.

- BRANDON POWELL** is back this season as well after returning 24 of 33 kickoffs for UF in 2015 and tallied an average of 21.2 yards with a long of 71.

- Florida has returned either a kickoff or punt for a TD for 11 straight seasons dating back to 2005, with 13 total punt return TDs during that span (including blocked punts).

KICKING

- EDDY PINEIRO** will handle the kicking duties this year. Pineiro only played seven games in his high school career,

primarily handling kickoff duties and extra points.

- Pineiro and Florida State's Ricky Aguayo are the only two kickers in the country who have made four field goals of 40+ yards this season. Pineiro is also the only FBS kicker with more than four attempts from 40+ yards this year.

- Pineiro was one of 11 FBS kickers to make all of his field goals (min. 3 attempts), and one of only two (Ricky Aguayo, Florida State) to make three field goals of 40-plus yards.

- Pineiro made his first career field goal attempt, a 41-yarder, to put the Gators ahead 10-7 against UMass, with eight seconds remaining in the second quarter. Pineiro also made 48- and 49-yarders in the fourth quarter, which were the longest made field goals by a Gator since Austin Hardin's 52-yarder at Florida State in 2014.

- Those were just the third and fourth made field goal of 40-plus yards in Florida's last 16 games, with the other coming last season's game-winning 43-yarder against Vanderbilt (Nov. 7, 2015).

- Pineiro's 54-yard field goal in the second quarter was the longest by a Gator since Caleb Sturgis made a 55-yarder in 2011, and tied the sixth-longest field goal in UF history.

- JORGE POWELL** returns this season after suffering a season-ending injury in week seven last season. Powell will compete with Pineiro throughout this season.

- Powell went 2 for 2 on his first two career field goal attempts vs. Ole Miss, after not registering an attempt against Tennessee.

COVERAGE UNITS

- Last weekend, UF's average field position was the 32, while Kentucky's average yard line to start a drive was its own 31 yard line.

- Florida ranked third in the conference and 12th in the country in punt return defense last season, as its opponents are only averaging 3.50 yards per return.

- Since 1990, Florida has outscored its opponents by a combined 6,407 to 2,624 at home, putting the average outcome at 38.4 to 15.7 in favor of the Gators and making the average outcome a 22.7-point win.
- The Gators had two significant winning streaks at The Swamp in the 1990s: a 23-game streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99. In 156 home games from 1990-2016, UF has scored 31 or more points 106 times and held its opponent to 14 or less points 93 times.
- With a 7-0 performance in The Swamp in 2012, the Gators matched the 2006 and 2009 squads in finishing with the most wins at home in a season. Florida will look to achieve that same mark next week when it hosts Florida State.

IN THE STANDS

- Florida broke its single-game attendance record in 2015, drawing 90,907 to The Swamp for the Nov. 28 showdown against Florida State. It marked the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 14 Super Bowls, three BCS national title games and has featured 18 bowl games that included a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title.
- Florida drew 90,227 fans for the head coach Jim McElwain's debut against New Mexico State last year, which was the largest opening-day crowd since 2009.
- Florida had six 90,000-plus crowds in six of its home games last season, which marks UF's most since 2010.
- The crowd of 90,907 for the UF-FSU game on Nov. 28, 2009, is the second-highest single-game total in school history.
- UF set a school attendance record during the 2009 season, averaging 90,635 per game, which ranked ninth in the nation. That broke the previous standard, set in 2008 when the Gators averaged 90,544. Florida averaged a crowd of 90,065 at home during the 2015 season.

TITLE CENTRAL

Florida is one of four schools to win three outright national titles since 1990. The 2006 and 2008 championships were won in the BCS National Championship Game, and Florida was the unanimous pick in all four major polls in 1996.

Athletics director Jeremy Foley announced Jim McElwain as the 25th head coach of the Florida football program on December 4, 2014. Following a successful debut season in 2015, McElwain was voted the SEC Coach of the Year by his peers and the media, becoming the only coach in school history to garner both awards in his debut season at UF.

McElwain led the Gators to a 10-4 overall record last season, making him the first coach in Florida football history to win 10 games in his inaugural campaign. In addition, McElwain became the 10th coach in SEC history to win 10 games in his first season as head coach, and one of only six to do it after inheriting a team that won less than nine games the year prior to his arrival.

Florida appeared in the SEC Championship game in Atlanta after going 7-1 in SEC play and winning the Eastern Division for the 11th time in school history and the first time since 2008. With that, McElwain became the only coach in UF history to lead the Gators to the title game in his debut season – an accomplishment shared by only two other coaches in the history of the Southeastern Conference.

During the regular season, Florida improved from a 6-5 mark in 2014 to a 10-2 regular season in 2015. The four-game turnaround tied the third-biggest one-year leap, in terms of wins, for the program in 32 years (0-10-1 in 1979, 7-4 regular season in 1980 and 6-6 in 2011, 11-1 regular season in 2012).

The Gators' defense carried the torch in 2015 as they ranked eighth nationally (third in the SEC) in total defense, allowing just 310.2 yards per game. Florida was the only team in the country to hold four FBS opponents to a third-down conversion rate of less than 17 percent. Additionally, the Gators were one of three teams to hold two FBS opponents under 10 percent in that category.

McElwain ushered in a passing attack that became only the fifth Gator squad since 1996 to throw at least 20 touchdown passes and fewer than 11 interceptions. In addition, UF's 405 attempts in 2015 were the most by any of the other Gator teams (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009) that accomplished that feat.

For the first time since 2008, six different Gators collected multiple receiving touchdowns.

In 2015, UF led the state with an average attendance of 90,065 for its seven home games – up almost 5,000 fans per game from the previous season.

Off the field, 22 student-athletes from his 2015 team were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and 119 players totaled more than 465 community service hours since he was hired in December 2014.

After being named the 2014 Mountain West Coach of the Year and the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year following his third season at Colorado State, McElwain accepted the head coaching job at Florida.

McElwain took over a struggling CSU program in 2012 and turned it around in just three seasons. The Rams had not had back-to-back winning seasons since 2002-03 and had won just three games each of the three years prior to McElwain's arrival. After going 4-8 in his first season in Fort Collins, CSU won eight games in 2013, its most wins in 12 seasons, including a victory in the New Mexico Bowl over Washington State.

McElwain spent the 2006 season in the NFL as quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders and served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Fresno State in 2007. He made an immediate impact, helping lead the Bulldogs to a 9-4 record, including a 40-28 triumph over Georgia Tech in the Humanitarian Bowl.

In his lone season directing the offense at Fresno State, he improved the Bulldogs' offensive output from 338.2 total yards per game the year before his arrival to 419.5 (No. 38 in the nation), and from 23.0 points per contest to 32.9 (No. 32).

McElwain served as the assistant head coach, receivers coach and special teams coach at Michigan State from 2003-05. The 2003 team reached the Alamo Bowl behind a receiving corps that set school records for receptions (312) and yards (3,510). He coached 2004 All-America punter Brandon Fields and kicker Dave Rayner, who led the Big Ten Conference in scoring. In 2005, five Spartan receivers had at least 28 receptions and the group combined to set another school record with 24 touchdown catches.

Prior to his stint at Michigan State, McElwain spent three seasons (2000-02) at Louisville as the receivers coach and special teams coach as the Cardinals earned bowl bids in each of those three seasons. He coached four first-team All-Conference USA selections at Louisville and also tutored three of the Cardinals' all-time leading receivers, including Deion Branch and Arnold Jackson.

From 1995-99, McElwain was the offensive coordinator, quarterbacks and receivers coach at Montana State. Under his direction, quarterback Rob Compson threw for nearly 7,000 career yards and a school-record 54 touchdowns. McElwain also coached the Bobcats' all-time leading receiver Chip Hobbs, who caught 144 career passes for 2,060 yards and 18 TDs. Montana State led the Big Sky Conference in scoring in 1998, averaging 31.6 points per game.

McElwain was at Eastern Washington from 1985-94 in a variety of capacities, starting as a graduate assistant and working his way up to quarterbacks and receivers coach. The Eagles made two NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances (1985 and 1992) and earned a share of the Big Sky Championship in 1992. McElwain coached EWU's all-time leading receiver, Tony Brooks (2,969 career yards), who earned third team AP All-America honors in 1993.

An all-state quarterback at Missoula (Montana) Sentinel High School, McElwain played quarterback at Eastern Washington from 1980-83 and earned his degree in Education from EWU in 1984.

He and his wife, Karen, have three children, JoHanna, Elizabeth and Jerret.

**DOUG NUSSMEIER****Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks**

- Has tutored four 3,000-yard passers in 13 seasons coaching college quarterbacks.
- In nine seasons as a coordinator, his offenses have produced seven individual 1,000-yard rushing seasons
- Coached Marc Bulger during the best year of his NFL career in 2006, when he threw for 4,301 yards and 24 touchdowns.
- The Gators outscored their opponents by 62 points (91-29) in the first quarter last season, marking their highest point differential in the first quarter since 2009.

**KERRY DIXON II****Wide Receivers**

- Dixon has spent 11 years coaching the offensive side of the ball, including one season as an offensive coordinator.
- In his first season at UF, Dixon coached true-freshman, Antonio Callaway, the first true freshman in UF history and one of only six SEC true freshmen since 2006 to post three 100-yard receiving games, including a season-best 112-yard outing (second-most by a UF true freshman) against Tennessee.
- Under Dixon's direction in 2015, and for the first time since 2008, six different Gators collected multiple receiving touchdowns.

**GREG NORD****Special Teams Coordinator / Tight Ends**

- Has over 35 years of coaching experience and enters his second at UF after serving as the running backs coach at Western Kentucky.
- Under Nord's direction in 2015, senior Jake McGee and sophomore DeAndre Goolsby were one of six FBS tight end duos, and the only pair of Gator tight ends since 1996 to each finish a campaign with 275-plus receiving yards and one receiving touchdown.
- McGee finished the 2015 season with AP Second-Team All-SEC honors.

**TIM SKIPPER****Running Backs**

- A versatile teacher, Skipper has coached on both sides of the ball and has served for all or parts of four seasons as a defensive coordinator.
- Under Skipper's direction in 2015, junior Kelvin Taylor paced the Florida offense all season and became the ninth Gator to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season. It was the 11th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history.
- Taylor's 259 carries were the second-most by a Gator in a single season and his 13 rushing touchdowns last year were the most by a Gator since 2009.

**MIKE SUMMERS****Offensive Line**

- Has 36 years of coaching experience, primarily coaching the offensive line and also spending 15 years as an offensive coordinator.
- Under Summer's direction in 2015, the Florida offensive line helped produce the Gator's ninth 1,000-yard rusher in program history.
- In his first season at Florida, the offensive line was one of the most consistent groups on the squad. The unit allowed just 16 sacks on the season, third-fewest in the SEC. 21-year coaching veteran and a former NFL quarterback.

**GEOFF COLLINS****Defensive Coordinator**

- Has 22 years of coaching experience and enters his second at UF after serving as the defensive coordinator for Mississippi State prior to his arrival.
- UF finished the 2015 season ranked eighth nationally (third in the SEC) in total defense, allowing just 310.2 yards per game. The 2015 Gators were one of seven FBS teams since 1996 to not allow a touchdown against three different FBS Power Five conference opponents in road or neutral-site games in the same season.

**TORRIAN GRAY****Defensive Backs**

- Gray spent the past 17 years coaching the defensive back position, including two years in the National Football League with the Chicago Bears.
- During that span, he coached five All-America defensive backs and 16 all-conference selections.
- Gray returns to Florida after spending a decade at his alma mater leading some of the nation's best defensive backfields.
- In his 10 seasons in Blacksburg coaching the secondary, his unit allowed just 185.0 passing yards per game and a 106.5 opponent passer rating.

**CHRIS RUMPH****Defensive Line**

- Has almost 20 years of coaching experience and enters his second at UF after serving as the Assistant Head Coach for Defense/Defensive Line coach at UT.
- Under Rumph's direction in 2015, UF ranked second in the SEC and fifth in the country with 40 sacks, while their 294 sack yards sat fourth nationally.
- Also in 2015, Florida's rush defense (128.07 ypg.) ranked 25th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC. Opponents averaged 3.53 yards per carry against UF's rush defense, a figure that ranked tied for 17th among FBS teams and fourth in the SEC.

**RANDY SHANNON****Associate Head Coach/Co-Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers**

- Has 24 years of coaching experience, serving as the head coach for University of Miami from 2007-10 and has won three national championships as a player and coach.
- Under Shannon's direction in 2015, and for first time since 2002, three separate Gators finished the season with 95-plus tackles: Antonio Morrison (103), Jarrad Davis (98), and Keanu Neal (96).
- Also in 2015, Florida's rush defense (128.07 ypg.) ranked 25th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.

**MIKE KENT****Director of Strength & Conditioning**

- Mike Kent joined the Florida football staff as the Director of Strength & Conditioning following a three-year stint in the same role at Colorado State under head coach Jim McElwain.
- Kent, who trained Darrelle Revis, Jordy Nelson and Deion Branch during their college careers, has 36 years of experience as a coach of football student-athletes, a career that includes 33 years as a highly-respected strength and conditioning instructor. He was recognized in 2013 as Master Strength and Conditioning Coach by the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches association, which signifies a commitment to student-athletes and the strength and conditioning profession.


