

OUR FOUNDATION IS OUR HERITAGE.

Our college is the 4th oldest in the U.S. and the accomplishments of our past faculty and students continue to inspire us today. In 1954, our college joined the University of Cincinnati under the leadership of Dean Joseph Kowalewski. In June, the university's Board of Trustees voted to rename the home of the college "Kowalewski Hall" in honor of his key role at a critical time in the life of our college. On November 9th this fall, we will be hosting an official renaming ceremony.

THE JAMES L. WINKLE College of Pharmacy had its campus home recently renamed for a beloved and influential leader in the field of pharmacy: Joseph F. Kowalewski, who was dean of the college from 1949 to 1970.

Raised in Wisconsin, Kowalewski earned a degree from the University of Chicago and graduate degrees from the University of Cincinnati. From 1931 to 1941, Kowalewski, while working on his doctorate, taught chemistry on a part-time basis at the Cincinnati College of Pharmacy, an independent pharmacy school which opened in 1850.

Kowalewski eventually earned appointment as director of research at Sperti, Inc. in Cincinnati where he worked developing cosmetics, detergents, food products and pottery glazes. He also oversaw the development of Preparation H® and is credited with coining the name for the product.


In the fall of 1949, Kowalewski returned to the Cincinnati College of Pharmacy as dean. He revitalized school finances by raising a substantial endowment and directed the merger of the school with the University of Cincinnati in 1954 to become the university's

13th college. His leadership secured continued educational accreditation and the development of new degree programs at the college, strengthening pharmacy education in Cincinnati.

Dean Joe, as he was affectionately known around the college, died in March 2000 at age 100. By University Board of Trustee action this June, his transformational leadership will continue to be recognized, as the Health Professions Building, home to the College of Pharmacy, will now be known as Joseph F. Kowalewski Hall.

"Dean Kowalewski's powerful impact to the Winkle College of Pharmacy and the pharmacy community is still felt today. He endeared himself to all his students and strived to make pharmacy education affordable for them. Dr. Kowalewski saved, secured, invested, educated and transformed what we know today as the Winkle College of Pharmacy."



An experience of hospital based and specialty health care

"STRAIGHT UP FANTASTIC!"

is the rave review from Tyler Vest, a fourth-year UC pharmacy student finishing up a clinical pharmacy rotation in trauma service at University of Cincinnati Medical Center (UCMC). Located within steps of UC's pharmacy college, UCMC—the University's affiliated teaching hospital provides 90 clinical pharmacy rotations, with an additional 75 rotations at outlying UC Health locations. The majority of pharmacy students who rotate at UCMC come from UC's James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy, but UCMC also precepts students from Ohio Northern and Ohio State University.

Pharmacy rotations here began about 50 years ago and started with general rotations such as medicine, surgery and ambulatory care. The program gradually expanded to include specialty areas and now has 20-25 preceptors who oversee more than a dozen student rotations each month.


UCMC clinical pharmacist and preceptor Kiranpal Singh Sangha, PharmD, who developed the specialty rotation in neurocritical care in 1991, says students here

get a "good exposure" to institutionally based health care.

The experiential learning program, he says, is set up to provide students with both the knowledge of how a hospital system works and the training to determine whether clinical hospital pharmacy is the career

path they see themselves taking.

"A lot of this you don't see until you are with a pharmacist in this environment, so you spend the rotation really deciding, 'Can I see myself here?"says fourth-year UC pharmacy student Tara Lines, adding, "You definitely have experiences you wouldn't expect."





In addition to general rotations in medicine, surgery and ambulatory care, UCMC rotations include:

Hart Pharmacy

An independent pharmacy close to its community

IT'S IMPOSSIBLE to be in more than one place at a time. Unless you are Mimi Hart, the owner of Hart Pharmacy on Cincinnati's west side.

In addition to running the independent pharmacy her father, Thomas Hart, opened in 1960. Hart sits on the board of Santa Maria Community Services, helped found the community action group, Price Hill Will, and volunteers as a pharmacy consultant to two drug addiction rehabilitation centers: the Center for Chemical Addictions Treatment, a medically monitored detox facility with short term inpatient and outpatient services, and First Step Home, a drug rehabilitation center for pregnant women.

And she serves as a preceptor in the clinical skills lab of her alma mater—the James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy.

"I get a lot of stuff done in the middle of the night," Hart responds when asked how she manages to be a full-time pharmacist, stay connected to pharmacy education at UC and continues to be so actively involved in community service.

"As an independent pharmacy we are very close to our patients and our community. We try to foster an environment where community service is valued and encouraged."

Of Note: Mimi Hart was awarded the American Pharmacists
Association Bowl of Hygeia
Award by the Ohio Pharmacists
Association in 2012. The award recognizes pharmacists who possess outstanding records of civic leadership in their communities and encourages pharmacists to take active roles in their communities. Hart is the only woman in Ohio to hold the award.

Her work ethic and exceptionalism also earned Mimi Hart the honor of being named a Cincinnati Enquirer Woman of the Year, Class of 2014.

OUR FOCUS IS OUR STUDENTS.

This fall, the University of Cincinnati set a new enrollment record with 44,274 students. At our college, we had 457 students when I arrived as dean in August 2013 and we have 491 students today, a 7.5% increase. Despite the large numbers, we strive to treat each student as an individual. The service learning component of our curriculum aims to produce pharmacists who are compassionate and reflective practitioners. We are in the midst of enhancing our learning environment for our students through a \$27 million renovation to Kowalewski Hall and a \$5 million renovation to research laboratories for our college in the Medical Sciences Building.

This Schoolhouse Rocked It

REMEMBER the Schoolhouse Rock song "How a Bill Becomes a Law." Well, this is the grown up version.

In December 2014 Ohio's Governor John Kasich signed a bill into law that lowered the age of patients at which a pharmacist may administer certain immunizations and expands immunizations a pharmacy intern may administer.

The law, which went into effect March 19, 2015, was a change that students and faculty from the James L. Winkle College of Pharmacy have lobbied for since 2013.

Under the old law, pharmacists could only give flu shots to individuals 14 years old or older and pharmacy interns may give flu shots to individuals 18 years old or older. Under the new law both pharmacists and pharmacy interns may give flu shots to individuals starting at 7 years old.

"It is very rare when students can play such an integral role in changing the laws that determine how they will practice," the college's Director of Experiential Training, Assistant Professor Michael Doherty, PharmD, explains of how the bill was born during the first Professionalism and Advocacy elective he taught. The students invited Senator Eric Kearney to speak and were encouraged to take an active role in the laws that govern their profession, says Doherty.

While all 50 states allow pharmacists to immunize patients, restrictions vary from state to state.

Speaking as a student pharmacist, pharmacy intern and as the University of Cincinnati student representative to the Ohio Pharmacists Association Board of Trustees, PharmD candidate (now graduate class of 2015) Erin Rogers testified to lawmakers in support of a new bill on three occasions and explained in her testimony how expanding the scope of practice for pharmacists and pharmacy interns would increase access to health care for Ohioans.

The Ohio Pharmacists Association was the main backer of the bill, which passed by a strong majority in both the Senate and the House.



Cosmetic Science

Program Scope Broadens; Research Collaborations Expand

COSMETIC SCIENCE at the Winkle College of Pharmacy is an area of emphasis in the Biomembrane track of the Graduate Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences offering MS and PhD training to full time students and certificate and MS level training to students participating in the Cosmetic Science Distance Learning program. The latter is growing rapidly and now has more than 60 matriculated students. Discussions have been initiated to expand the program internationally, spurred by an ongoing interest in Asia and, most recently, in China.

Skin Science and Technology Center

UC RESEARCH in cosmetic science has broadened through new collaborations with both internal and external partners and is now organized under the framework called the Skin Science and Technology Center (SSTC) operating under the auspices of the University of Cincinnati Research Institute. The SSTC, currently led by College of Pharmacy Professor Gerald Kasting, PhD, involves researchers from four UC colleges—Pharmacy, Medicine, Engineering and Arts & Sciences—working collaboratively to solve problems of interest to industrial partners.

It has received significant support from industry giant Procter & Gamble through their extramural research program, Connect & Develop.
