## A Guide For UC Students And Employees On Homeland Security Levels

While there are many variables in the University's security response to changes in the Homeland Security Threat Level, this document identifies general changes or impacts that students and employees can expect to see.

Level	Emergency Actions That May Occur
Severe A terrorist attack has occurred or is imminent. Normally applies to a specific location.	<ul> <li>Classes may be cancelled</li> <li>Buildings may be closed</li> <li>Expect delays in entering garages and buildings</li> <li>Expect severe restrictions to visitors, vendors, and deliveries</li> </ul>
High High risk of terrorist attack, but no specific target identified.	<ul> <li>Access to buildings may be restricted to a single point</li> <li>Visitors, vendors, and deliveries may receive increased scrutiny</li> <li>Parking may be restricted in some areas</li> <li>Delays may be expected in entering garages and buildings</li> <li>Belongings may be inspected prior to entry to some areas</li> </ul>
Elevated Elevated risk of terrorist attack, but no specific region or target identified.	<ul> <li>Increased security presence may be expected at large events</li> <li>Belongings may be inspected prior to entry to some events</li> </ul>
Guarded General risk of terrorism, but no specific threats or targets.	Employees should expect to participate in drills or training exercises in relation to emergency procedures
Low Low risk of terrorist attacks.	<ul> <li>Students and employees will be issued identification badges</li> <li>Employees will receive periodic training in emergency procedures</li> </ul>
