Alba Iulia is located in the centre of Romania, south-east of the Apuseni Mountains, and is one of Romania's most important historical cities. Alba Iulia was the capital of Dacia Apulensis (1st century), and of the Transylvanian Principality (16th century). The first step towards the temporary unification of the Romanian principalities was made here (Michael the Brave, November 1st 1599). We have to mention the medieval cultural tradition, when the Orthodox Archbishopric was established here and Alba Iulia was an important centre of Romanian printing houses. The New Testament (1648) and The Psaltery (1651) were first printed here.

Alba Iulia was the first capital of the three Romanian provinces and here the Great National Assembly was held on December 1, 1918. For Romanian history it was a special moment because it marked the Union between Transylvania and Banat with the Romanian Kingdom. In 1922, King Ferdinand I and Queen Mary celebrated here their official coronation as sovereigns of United Romania.



Our University is located in the middle of Alba Carolina Fortress, the most representative of Vauban type in Europe. The Fortress was built between 1714 and 1738 and it was designed by the Italian architect Giovanni Morando Visconti.

The main buildings of the University are located near the Reunification Cathedral and The National Museum of Unification, close to The Route of the Three Fortifications.



THE UNIVERSITY IN THE CITY



"1 DECEMBRIE 1918" UNIVERSITY OF ALBA IULIA was set up as a public higher education and research institution founded pursuant to the Romanian Government Decision no. 474/09.07.1991. Its name is related to the historical moment (1918) when the union of the three Romanian provinces was accomplished at Alba Iulia. In 2009, following to the institutional assessment carried out by the Executive Bureau of the Romanian Agency for Quality Assurance in Higher Education – ARACIS, "1 Decembrie 1918" University of Alba Iulia was awarded a HIGH CONFIDENCE RATING.

The aim of the university is to constantly develop an academic community, able to enhance the value of the archaeological, social, economic and cultural heritage of our region, and create new and auspicious conditions for the students interested in scientific accomplishment and academic performance.

Our University is also committed to continuing the process of extending, modernising and adapting its research and education facilities, and in developing a complex – both theoretical and practical – academic training system for all those who are willing to become highly qualified specialists in different fields of activity. Therefore, we are permanently improving our undergraduate BA and BSc programmes, as well as post-graduate studies (Master and Ph.D. programmes). The academic programmes are aligned with the Bologna system.

"1 Decembrie 1918" University of Alba Iulia currently has collaboration agreements with more than 120 educational and cultural institutions from abroad. Most of the agreements are focused on the exchange of students and staff (teaching staff, researchers and administrative staff), exchange of publications, journals and teaching materials, co-organisation of conferences and other academic events, and participation in research and educational projects.

The university welcomes students from all over the world to enroll in one of the undergraduate or postgraduate programmes offered by its four faculties. For international students the University organises a preparatory year.

FACULTY OF HISTORY AND PHILOLOGY

The Faculty of History and Philology brings together the humanities specialisations of the University, which are also the first programmes of higher education in Alba Iulia. The Faculty of History and Philology consists of two large departments: the Department of History, Archaeology and Museology, and the Department of Philology, each with its own faculty members and academic and research programmes.

The Faculty of History and Philology boasts all the necessary facilities for a top-quality educational process: libraries (University Library, Batthyaneum Library, Library of the National Union Museum, National Archives – Alba County), access to databases (e.g. ProQuest, JSTOR, Emerald, Science Direct, Thompson ISI Web of Knowledge, etc.), state-of-the-art laboratories and lecture halls, archaeological and restoration sites.

The Faculty has also established partnerships with national and international institutions of higher education. As a result, our students can take advantage of exchange programmes (study mobility and work placement mobility) at partner universities in France, Italy, Greece, Germany, Poland, Austria, Spain, Hungary, China, Slovakia, the Czech Republic, Macedonia, Bulgaria, Denmark, Finland, Holland, Norway, Lithuania, Portugal, Turkey, Malta, etc.

THE CENTRE FOR ECONOMIC RESEARCH carries out fundamental and applied research in the field of economics. The center has international recognition and is currently under evaluation from the National University Research Council. The research priorities are in the field of accounting, finances, economic and financial analysis, management, marketing, science of commodities, econometrics etc.

THE "INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND FOOD QUALITY CONTROL" has a multidisciplinary character by involving a significant number of Romanian and foreign specialists in the domains of sustainable development, sustainable changes, quality and food safety. The centre activity is based on fundamental, applied and experimental researches, aiming to identify the economical and environmental concerns at both regional and international levels, on the one hand; on the other hand, it focuses on the specific tools identification and development, the main goal being the long term training activity, expertise, consultancy and technological transfer.

THE SOCIOLOGICAL RESEARCH CENTRE is oriented towards fundamental and applied research in sociology and interdisciplinary fields. Interest areas are general sociology, social research methodology, community and regional development, social issues, communication, education, voting behaviour.

THE RESEARCH CENTRE IN EDUCATIONAL SCIENCES carries out fundamental and applied research of design and development in the field of education sciences (psychology of education, theory and methods of training and evaluation, theory and practice of the curriculum, ICT's, counseling and orientation, educational management, economy of education, adult education and life long lerning).

THE CENTRE FOR PEDAGOGICAL ANALYSIS AND DEVELOPMENT aims to research and implement in the University modern teaching and learning technologies, specialty didactics adapted to higher education, procedures to initiate, monitor and evaluate study programms, innovative methods of student counseling and career guidance.

THE INTER-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH CENTRE IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES AND THE HUMANITIES has the objective of combining human and material resources in the social sciences and the humanities, by carrying out interdisciplinary research that involves other areas of research such as education sciences, sociology, psychology, social work, social and educational management.

THE TERRITORIAL DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH CENTRE intends to promote, support and participate in projects that are multi-disciplinary and oriented towards supporting governance participation in the context of a knowledge-based society which relies on scientific information resulting from different lines of research.

THE CENTRE OF RESOURCE AND INFORMATION IN SOCIAL OCCUPATIONS carries out fundamental and applied research in the field of social work and in related, interdisciplinary fields. The priority research subjects are: social research methodology, social issues and social policies, interpersonal communication, crisis interventions, social education, community development, social services management and management of social work projects.

THE RESEARCH CENTRE IN THE FIELD OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LAW conducts research activities and organises international conferences that bring together researchers and specialists in European law.

The Faculty of Orthodox Theology was founded in 1990, after the fall of the atheistic totalitarian regime in Romania. It is co-founder of "1 Decembrie 1918" University of Alba Iulia, together with the Faculty of History and Philology.

At first there was just one academic programme, namely Social Theology and subsequently the following specializations were established: Pastoral Theology (1995), Theology and Language Teacher Education (1996), Theology and Language Teacher Education (2003), History and Theology (2003).

After the university education reform initiated in 2005 (while reduced the number of specialized academic requirements under the Declaration of Bologna), the 5 theological departments were converted into 3.

THE FACULTY OF ORTHODOX THEOLOGY



THE "SAINT SERGE" RESEARCH CENTRE was established as a result of the partnership between the Faculty of Orthodox Theology and the Orthodox Theology Institute "Saint Serge", Paris. The center carries out research in the field of Theology and related disciplines.

THE INTER-RELIGIOUS AND CHRISTIAN PSYCHO-PEDAGOGY RESEARCH CENTRE belongs to the Faculty of Orthodox Theology and carries out research in the field of Theology and collateral disciplines, fostering at the same time a dialogue of different religions and confessions. Furthermore, the Centre answers the need for Christian education and spiritual guidance of the Romanian contemporary society, attempting in the first place to restore participation in the community by reviving the clear pedagogical and therapeutic character of the ecclesiastic work, both in its cultic and cultural (Samaritan) dimension.

Each year, the Faculty of Orthodox Theology organizes an International Symposium, with researchers, teachers and specialists from various universities from Romania and from abroad.

RESEARCH STRUCTURES



The Centre for International Relations is the pacesetter for the internationalisation strategy of "1 Decembrie 1918" University of Alba Iulia, developed in cooperation with and endorsed by the university management for the current mandate (2012-2016). The main tenets of this strategy are construed along the following lines: extending the international dimension of research activities, and teaching/learning processes, raising intercultural and pluringual awareness, and active involvement in social and corporate governance.

We actively foster the mobility of teachers and students and we continuously extend our cooperation with institutions worldwide, either through bilateral agreements or collaborating in different types of networks (Association of Carpathian Regional Universities, Consortium in Humanities, European Network for Intercultural Education Activities, etc.). Our university has currently concluded 101 Erasmus+ agreements with higher education institutions for student and staff mobility, as well as 50 Erasmus+ agreements with various institutions for student placement. We yearly host a number of approximately 150 outgoing students and 50 incoming students within the Erasmus+ mobility Programme. Our university is in the process of implementing the International Credit Mobility within the Erasmus+ Programme with Partner Countries with whom besides mobility programmes we will develop collaborative educational and research activities, such as: co-organising thematic conferences (GeoCAD, ICTAMI, BENA, etc.), co-publishing periodical volumes of conference proceedings and peer-reviewed academic journals. We have already established successful joint PhD programmes, and we are looking into new vistas offered by ERA+ and Horizon 2020.

THE CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS



The University Library is a modem, computerized library with a stock of over 100,000 volumes (together with the Archbishopric Library) that cover almost all fields of interest. The Orthodox Archbishopric Library is located on the premises of the Faculty of Orthodox Theology and provides services which are similar to the ones of the University's Library, both sharing a common database.

The Library's services are open to all University students, (BA, MA, Ph.D.), researchers, teaching professional and administrative staff.

The database of the Library can be accessed through the OPAC software. The library is organised on home loan and reading rooms with over 100 seats, offering free access to the shelf. The access to the Library's collections is made based on a Library Card, issued according to the Library by-laws.

There are additional services available to the readers in exchange of a small fee.

The library includes four reading rooms with free access to the shelf located on the first floor of the building, where readers can make photocopies; there is also a loan section, a reading room and the acquisitions and archiving department on the ground floor; a multimedia room is located in the attic of the Library's building equipped with 50 computers, where students can check the electronic databases to which the University is a subscribed user; there are digitized teaching/learning materials which students can also purchase.

THE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY



The University has 5 modern **Student Residence Halls**, with a total capacity of 948 places. The standard facilities and appliances in each Residence Hall include triple bed rooms with modern furniture, bathroom, refrigerator, TV, Internet connection, a launderette, a multifunctional hall, study rooms and kitchens with gas stoves and electric hoods. Inside the campus there is a modern gym.

The University has also got a **Guest House** with 32 rooms (studios and apartments equipped with a private bathroom, refrigerator and TV) which are used to accommodate professors from Romania and abroad, as well as for delegates in scientific events organized by the University.

Students can have lunch at the **University's Restaurant** located on the premises of the Campus with the following facilities: a room with 200 seats, 2 rooms for special occasions (social events, conferences, and official meetings) with 39 seats; an automatic line for preparing food with modern kitchen appliances. The University's Restaurant offers the possibility to have lunch à la carte.

The University also has a **snack bar** with an open-air terrace (during summer time), as well as outdoor recreational areas within the historical grounds of Alba Iulia Fortress.

STUDENT ACCOMODATION



University students can benefit from the cultural-artistic and entertainment facilities and services provided by the Students' House of Culture. The institution offers rooms for rehearsals and shows, and through its specialized staff or partners, it provides different training courses in traditional and modern Romanian music, modern and ballroom dancing, etc.

Three students and alumni organisations are active within the University: the University Students' League (LSUA), The Association of Christian-Orthodox Students (ASCOR), and the Alumni Association (ALUMNI).

The "Gaudeamus" International Study and Conference Centre has been especially designed and equipped to host most of the national and international scientific and cultural events organized by the University. It also has rooms for teaching/learning activities, including laboratories and study rooms.



By airplane:

International airports in Romania: Bucharest, Cluj-Napoca, Timişoara, Sibiu, Constanţa, Arad and Suceava. Cluj-Napoca and Sibiu are the closest.

By train:


