
HKS CURRICULUM

POLICY ANALYSIS EXERCISE (PAE)

Do you have a project that could use the analytical skills of a Harvard Kennedy School student? Become a PAE client and benefit from an in-semester consulting project. Sample projects:

- Delivered to a ministry of foreign service an assessment and recommendations for improving gender equality in a country's diplomatic corps
- Issued recommendations to a U.S. state agency for reducing pharmaceutical costs
- Provided recommendations to a U.S. mayor for reorganizing the city's overall management of transportation
- Conducted an analysis of an international agricultural social enterprise and advised how to scale up the business model
- Delivered recommendations to a U.S. think tank on military strategy and conflict mitigation
- Analyzed the exploitation of children for labor and provided best practices for intervention

SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

Hire a Harvard Kennedy School student for the summer and discover the skills and passion our students bring to their work. Here are just a few of the ways students have helped organizations across the globe:

- Evaluated for an international NGO the effectiveness of an academic program for refugee children by creating an assessment structure and collecting and analyzing data
- Provided strategic and marketing plans for new Latin American investment initiative to engage Hispanic Americans in impact investing domestically and abroad
- Analyzed, researched, and authored draft report for multilateral organization on impact of labor and economic development policies on migrant domestic workers
- —» Used data analytics to advise U.S. Department of Defense on countering terrorist recruitment practices
- Provided research support to senior staff in the mayor's office of a major U.S. city on issues such as public safety, flood policy and insurance, and clean energy vehicles

Most students are searching for summer opportunities in January and February. Students undertaking unpaid internships in the public or nonprofit sectors can apply for funding support. Funding deadlines begin in February; in many cases, students must have an offer in hand to be eligible to apply.

Employers using our services are expected to abide by our Employer Policy, which can be found in JACK. Highlights of this policy include:

- The principle of non-discrimination in recruiting and hiring of any person on the basis of race, color, sex, sexual orientation, religion, age, national or ethnic origin, political beliefs, veteran status, or handicap.
- Students should not be required to accept full-time offers before the beginning of spring term (late January) summer internship offers before spring break (mid-March) or three weeks after an offer is made, whichever date is later.
- Should an employer not be able to abide by the timing above, clear expectations are set during the interview/offer process.
