Citizenship and Social Security

The U.S. Department of Education matches data reported on the FAFSA to other federal databases to verify items such as citizenship and social security information. This process is called a federal edit. The Department's federal processor has notified the UC Berkeley Financial Aid and Scholarships Office that you have not passed the federal edit for social security, citizenship, or both of these items. Because there are a variety of reasons why you may have failed one or more of the federal edits, we are providing this explanation sheet to assist you in submitting the documents that UC Berkeley must collect to correct or verify your data. This form is used to document either your social security number or your citizenship with the UC Berkeley Financial Aid and Scholarships Office. The documentation you are required to submit is printed on page one of this form.

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The federal edit for eligible non-citizen matches your name, birth date, and Alien Registration Number to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) database. If you failed the database match, it may be due to processing problems on the part of the DHS or the federal processor, or it may be due to a change in your name or an incorrect birth date or Alien Registration Number. If you passed the social security edit, and your Alien Registration Number appears to be correct, UC Berkeley will send your documents to the local DHS office for confirmation. If you failed the social security number edit, or if your Alien Registration Number appears incorrect, UC Berkeley will correct the data elements (e.g. alien number, name, birth date, or social security number) and resubmit them to the federal processor for a second match to the database.
