TRAINING FOR BORDER SECURITY FORCE

SAWEN in collaboration with Department of National Parks and Wildlife (DNPWC) and National Trust for Nature Conservation (NTNC) successfully organized a

three day "Wildlife Law Enforcement Training for Armed Police Force (APF) Nepal" from June 13-15, 2016 in Kathmandu, Nepal. The major aim of the training was to provide a comprehensive understanding of wildlife crime and wildlife parts identification to help curb the transnational illegal wildlife trade as the APF works in border areas. Thirty one APF officers from various border



areas of Nepal took part in the first ever training on wildlife crime.

The training was funded by Strengthening Regional Cooperation for Wildlife Protection in Asia Project of the World Bank through PCU-NTNC. SAWEN will continue enhancing capacity of enforcement agencies working in border areas across South Asia in view of controlling the increasing trans-border trafficking in wildlife parts.

TWO HELD FOR POSSESSING LEOPARD SKIN

Two people were arrested on charges of possessing a nine feet long leopard skin in Jalpaiguri district of West Bengal. The accused identified as Kalu Singh Biswakarma, a poacher, and Arjun Kumar Rasaily, an agent, are of Bhutanese origin. Acting upon a tip-off, forest officials of Balecoba range apprehended the accused in the nearby Alipurdar district when they were trying to smuggle the skin to Nepal.

93 KGS OF PANGOLIN SCALES SEIZED

AIZAWL, June 3, 2016: About 93 kgs of pangolin scales were seized from a person in Champhai town along Mizoram-Myanmar border, police said on 3 June. The scales were recovered from one C Thanga (38) yesterday and he was arrested. The seized pangolin scales are worth around IRs 20 lakh in the local market and were suspected to be smuggled to China through Myanmar, a police official said.

ILLEGAL MULTI MILLION DOLLAR LIZARD TRADE CONTINUES IN NORTHERN WEST BENGAL

SILIGURI, June 9, 2016: High value illegal trade of a lizard, 'Tokay Gecko' is going on unabated from NE region and adjoining Indo-Bhutan border region. Starting from deep North East to Indo-Nepal border in northern West Bengal, entire region frequently witnesses seizures and apprehensions of people trading the animal.

But its final destination or purpose is not yet clear. According to security agency intelligence, high price tag of over USD 2 million for each living one of over 300 gram weight makes the animal too vulnerable. "Many times, low weight Geckos, are injected with mercury to increase weight though that eventually kills the animal after some days," said an official.

INTERNATIONAL SMUGGLER AMONG SEVEN CONVICTED

KURNOOL, July 19, 2016: India: International red sanders smuggler Fayaz Shariff (40) and six other smugglers were sentenced to undergo three-year imprisonment and pay a fine of IRs. 10,000 by the Judicial First Class Magistrate of Pulivendula, Srinivasa Naik, on 18 July. Kadapa Superintendent of Police P.H.D. Ramakrishna said Fayaz Shariff, a native of Katiganahalli in Karnataka, an accused in 83 cases, including 45 cases in Kadapa district and 38 cases in Chittoor district, was arrested by the Kadapa police in October last. Six other red sanders smugglers of Vempalle -- Yemineni Krishna Reddy, Chinnanagireddy Sridevi, Boreddy Ramakrishna Reddy, Kathireddy Kesava Reddy, Srinivasulu Reddy, and Udumu Srinivasulu -- were also convicted, the SP said.

4 Indians held in Malaysia for possessing protected turtles

KUALA LUMPUR, July 26, 2016: Four Indians have been detained by Malaysian authorities for investigation after seizing more than 1,000 exotic turtles during a sting operation in Malaysia. "A total of 1,011 Star tortoises and 23 Indian Roofed turtles were seized," Natural Resources and Environment Minister Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar said. Two suspects were detained in the first raid at a house in the suburb of Petaling Jaya on 25 July while other two suspected were picked from a budget hotel on following day.

DUO JAILED TWO YEARS FOR CRUELTY TO INDIAN SPOTTED TURTLES

PETALING JAYA, Aug 2 —Two of the four suspects detained in raids by the Wildlife and National Parks Peninsular Malaysia Department last week have been sentenced to two years jail each at the Kuala Lumpur Sessions Court. Indian nationals Nagoor Kani Kamal Basha, 34, and Nizamudeen Shamshudeen, 39, pleaded guilty to three counts of possession without documents and causing pain to 36 Black Pond Turtles under the Wildlife Conservation Act 2010 (Act716).

CHINA-BASED RED SANDERS SMUGGLER, AIDE ARRESTED; 190 LOGS SEIZED

KURNOOL, August 21, 2016: An international smuggler based in China, K.A. Dawood Jagir alias Jakir (52) involved in 57 cases in India, and his cousin and aide Firoz Dastagir were arrested with 190 red sanders logs. Kadapa district police arrested them at Akepadu Crossroads on Rajampet-Rayachoti Road on 20 August. Jagir, a key aide of international smugglers Kollam Gangi Reddy and Sahul Hameed alias Sahul Bhai of Dubai, also has links with international smugglers Chen Chengai, Santhan Meeran, Jang Yang and Wang Li Fa of China, Jimmy of Hong Kong, Hanif and David of Singapore and Shanmugan of Myanmar, said Mr. N. Sridhar Rao, Inspector-General of Police, South Zone. Besides the logs, two cars, a lorry, a mini-van, two mobile phones, one tab and IRs.10,000 were seized from them.

RS 7.7 LAKH WORTH PROCESSED SEA CUCUMBER SEIZED

RAMESWARAM, July 28, 2016: Seventy-seven kg of processed sea cucumber worth IRs 7.7 lakh, meant to be smuggled to Sri Lanka, was seized by coastal marine police at a village near Mandapam this on 28 July in the morning. The sea cucumbers were seized from Marakaiyarpattinam village and one person was arrested in this connection, police said. INDIAN TRAFFICKING TORTOISES AND BIRDS FOR CHINA VIETNAM CUISINE ARRESTED

KATHMANDU, June 17, 2016: Nepalese authorities have arrested an Indian national in Kathmandu for the third time for allegedly smuggling 109 tortoises and 162 birds of different species from India to be supplied to restaurants in China and Vietnam. Police arrested Mohammad Usman, hails from Patna in Bihar, on 16 June after a raid in his house. They recovered the reptiles and birds kept in boxes and cages. The tortoises, which weigh three to five kilogrammes each, and the birds, including several varieties of parrots, were smuggled to Nepal from India, police said. The seized animals were supposed to be illegally transported to China and Vietnam for the purpose of feeding on restaurants and in the markets for reselling them.

TWO HELD WITH TIGER BONES IN KHULNA

July 20, 2016: In an operation, members of Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) arrested two alleged smugglers with tiger bones from Ferryghat near Betbunia Bazar in Paikgachha upazila in Khulna on 20 July evening. The arrestees were identified as Golam Rasul (45) of Baghba village and Khalil Gazi (32) of Betbunia village in Koyra upazila. RAB sources said they contacted the arrested smugglers in the guise of tiger bone buyers.

6 HELD WITH TIGER SKIN IN KHULNA

August 25, 2016: Police arrested six people along with a tiger skin during a raid in a house of Abul Kalam and recovered a pipe gun and three bullets from Koyra upazila of Khulna on 24 August night. The arrestees were identified as Abul Kalam (44), Sohrab (42), Abdur Rab (63), Jamal (33), Masum Billah (29), and Golam Rabbani (24) from Koyra. They were preparing to smuggle the skin out of the country.

Tipped off, a team of Detective Branch of police raided the house of Abul Kalam at Chakratala village around 8.00pm and arrested the six along with the tiger skin, said Akkas Ali, officer-in-charge of Khulna Detective Branch.

POACHER KILLED IN KAZIRANGA

GUWAHATI, May 28, 2016: Authorities of Kaziranga National Park foiled rhino poaching attempt by killing one of the poachers on 28 May morning. The poachers opened fire first then forest team responded and one poacher got injured during the exchange of fire, later succumbed. The two other poachers however, managed to escape. One .303 rifle and live ammunition were recovered from the spot.

FOREST OFFICIALS SEIZE 160 PARAKEETS, 300 MUNIYA BIRDS FROM FOUR WOMEN

TRICHY, June 20, 2016: Forest officials seized 160 parakeets and 300 muniya birds from four women in the city on 19 June. The women were arrested when they were trying to flee to Chennai. Acting on a tip-off, a team of forest personnel were patrolling the Central Bus Stand from yesterday night. Around 4 am, four women in possession of 160 parakeets and 300 muniya birds came to the bus stand to catch a bus to Chennai. Forest personnel immediately spotted them and seized the birds. Ayyammal, 46, Rajamani, 71, Rajeswari, 61, and Pavunammal, 75, all hailing from Kuruvikaran Street near Palakkarai in Trichy, were booked.

Skins of tiger and leopard seized

AMRITSAR, June 30, 2016: Skins of a tiger and leopard were confiscated by the Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) in Amritsar on 30 June. The SPCA team conducted a raid at Ranjit Avenue after they received input that a man sitting in one of the parks was carrying tiger and leopard skin. The smuggler fled from the scene but left the skins behind. It was yet to ascertain the source and investigation was underway.

ILLEGAL ONLINE WILDLIFE TRADE

NEW DELHI, July 18, 2016: Trade of rare animals and their body parts is going on through popular websites the government said on 17 July. Environment, Forests and Climate Change Minister Mr. Anil Madhav Dave said online smuggling of rare animals and their parts are being monitored by the state and central governments as part of combating cyber crime. He furnished a list of 106 such websites collated by the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (WCCB). These include prominent names like quikr.com, olx.in, alibaba.com, eBay.com, youtube.com, amazon.com, shopping.rediff.com, petsmart.com and snapdeal.com.

Officials seize 4,000 live baby tortoises

CHENNAI, August 29, 2016: As many as 4,000 tiny red-eared tortoises were caught by the customs officials at the Chennai city airport for the second time this month. Mohamed Habib, a native of Ramanathapuram, tried to smuggle in the tortoises in his suitcase from Malaysia. "Around 4,000 tortoises, all sized about one inch each, were dumped in a suitcase two feet in length and one and half feet in breadth" said an official.



26 days ago, he was found carrying 5,000 live tortoises. "However, he paid the fine of `5,000 and was released," said the officer. He had travelled from China via Kuala Lumpur in a transit flight through Malaysian Airlines and was caught when he reached Chennai.

A single bench of District Judge Mr. Tek Narayan Kunwar has issued this verdict on 27 June. This is the maximum punishment given for a rhino poacher. Chepang had been arrested from Malaysia with the help of INTERPOL.

70 red panda hides seized in fours years

August 13, 2016: According to statistics of the Metropolitan Police Office, the law enforcement agency has confiscated as many as 70 units of red panda hide, while District Forest Office, Kathmandu brought to book 180 poachers and wildlife criminals in the Kathmandu Valley in the past four years.

FORTY DEAD TIGER CUBS FOUND IN FREEZER AT THAI TEMPLE

THAILAND, June 1, 2016: Wildlife authorities in Thailand have found 40 tiger cubs in a freezer during a police raid on Tiger Temple, a tourist attraction that has faced repeated allegations of animal trafficking. The discovery occurred after officials from the Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP), backed by police, closed the temple this week to relocate 137 tigers to government-run sanctuaries. The cubs, some of them bloodied and mangled, were laid out on the floor along with other animals, including a binturong, a small rare species also known as a bearcat.



Promoting itself as a spiritual sanctuary for humans and animals, Tiger

Temple has been keeping the big cats and other animals for 15 years. It charges tourists to take photos of them stroking adult tigers and bottle-feeding cubs. The site has been accused of illegally breeding tigers and some visitors say the animals appear to be drugged. A handler was recently filmed smacking a tiger on the head.

The temple denies accusations of abuse and trafficking and other visitors have lauded the conditions and the care taken over the animals. Responding to requests for comment, the temple said on its Facebook page that a vet had requested the cubs be frozen and preserved six years ago. "He made that decision probably to keep as proof against the allegations of selling cubs," the temple said. "In 2010, the ex-vet of Tiger Temple changed [the] policy. Instead of cremation, the deceased cubs were preserved in jars or kept frozen. We have documented all the deaths from 2010 and have photographic evidence of them still being within the temple," it added.

Thailand is a central route for illicit wildlife trade through south-east Asia, including ivory and rhino horn. Tiger parts, including bone and penis, are used in traditional Chinese medicine. Raids often find the tigers cut in half with their organs preserved on ice. The CITES banned the trade in tiger parts and products. Thailand has an estimated 1,200-1,300 captive tigers in at least 33 facilities, he said.
