

EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES PROCEDURE FOR ON-LINE APPLICATION AND OTHER INFORMATION

ACADEMIC YEAR 2011-2012

- STUDENT SELECTION:

- I) The home university will officially select students who would like to take part in an exchange at the UIB (indicating the exchange programme, name and surname of the student, contact e-mail address, exchange period and field of study) and will send the candidates selected to the UIB:
- ERASMUS: erasmus.incoming@uib.es or fax: +34 971 172 649.
- Exchange Agreements: convenis.intercanvi@uib.es or fax: +34 971 172 763.
- SICUE-Séneca Programme: sicue.seneca@uib.es or fax: +34 971 172 763.

The UIB will only process the applications of officially selected students.

We would be grateful for students not to contact the UIB until they have been officially selected by their home university.

II) Once the UIB has received the selection from the home university, students will receive an e-mail from the International Relations Service confirming their selection to participate in an exchange programme at the UIB.

This message will contain: a) a link to the website containing the procedure for the online application and other information, b) a link to the on-line application form, c) a personal password to access the on-line application page.

- APPLICATION:

- **I)** Deadlines for on-line application:
- a) 15 June 2011: for exchanges during the first semester (from October to February) and whole year exchanges (from October to June).
- b) 15 October 2011: for exchanges during the second semester (from February to June).
- Outside these deadlines, the UIB cannot guarantee acceptance of the students selected.
- **II**) Once the on-line application has been presented and confirmed, students must send the following documentation by ordinary mail:
- a) A duly signed copy of the student on-line application form.





- b) A duly signed copy of the academic agreement proposed by the student.
- c) 2 photographs (passport size).
- d) A photocopy of their passport or national ID.
- e) Letter of intent (only for students on Exchange Agreements).
- Deadlines for sending the documentation to the UIB are the following:
- a) 30 July, 2011: for exchanges during the first semester (from October to February) and whole year exchanges (from October to June).
- b) 30 November, 2011: for exchanges during the second semester (from February to June).

- LANGUAGE COURSES





In the Balearic Islands there are two official languages: Catalan and Spanish. They are both used normally in all areas of public and private life. Spanish is one of the most widely used languages in the world and is a Romance language, just like Catalan, which means it is not difficult for a person who already speaks Spanish to learn Catalan.

This indiscriminate use of Catalan and Spanish reaches the area of the UIB. Lecturers are allowed to give their lectures in the language they feel most comfortable in and, likewise, students may write up their assignments or exams in either of the two languages.

In order to help people to adapt to the two languages, the International Relations service organizes Catalan and Spanish courses for mobility students. During the welcome activities organized by the International Relations service, in September-October and in February, placement tests will be made to place students in different groups, depending on their knowledge of the language. The charges and enrolment fees for the language courses may be consulted at the International Relations Service.


- WELCOME ACTIVITIES FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2011-2012:
