Greatbatch Medical, a leading manufacturer of implantable medical devices with facilities in Tijuana, Mexico, was the latest company to participate in the Otay Mesa Chamber of Commerce's MEXPORT Supplier's Forum. With labor and transportation costs rising in China, many manufacturers have been moving or expanding their operations to Mexico, as the country's proximity to the United States and stable labor costs have made manufacturing operations there more competitive. The forums, hosted in partnership with the San Diego CITD, aim to connect regional suppliers with large manufacturers in the Baja California region.

Supply chain managers and buyers from Greatbatch's Tijuana manufacturing facility presented information on the company's products and current sourcing needs. After the presentations, forum participants had the opportunity to meet the Greatbatch buyers individually and discuss potential business opportunities.

<u>California STEP</u>, funded in part by a grant from the U.S. Small Business Administration, facilitates export promotion activities, serving targeted industries to drive exports for small business.

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The San Diego CITD, in partnership with the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM) and the U.S. Department of Commerce assisted California-based companies with exhibiting at the NAMM Musikmesse and ProLight + Sound trade shows in Russia, which took place May 16 - 19th in Moscow.

The San Diego CITD was able to arrange discounted booth space and one-on-one meetings with qualified distributors - though a U.S. Department of Commerce <u>Gold Key Service</u> - for California-based music industry-related companies wishing to expand their business by exporting to Russia and the former Soviet Republics. Funding for this assistance was available in part by the <u>California State Trade and Export Promotion</u> (STEP) program from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

130 companies from 14 countries, including major industry brands, took part in the second edition of NAMM Musikmesse Russia and Prolight + Sound NAMM Russia trade shows. Three of those companies were able to qualify for the assistance provided through the San Diego CITD and exhibit at shows.

<u>Community College Faculty</u> at the International Business
Center hosted at Michigan State University from June 2nd-5th.

The International Business Institute for Community College Faculty is a unique professional development program

designed specifically for community and technical college faculty. The aim of the Institute is to provide participants with the knowledge, experience and resources they need to internationalize general business courses and/or develop specialized international business courses at the two-year college level. The program was a success with a total of 44 business faculty from 18 states that attended the institute this year.

High School Students Start Business with Help From CITD Youth Entrepreneurship Program



Aaron Estrada and Victor Cruz, seniors at High Tech High Chula Vista and San Diego CITD Youth Entrepreneurship Program (YEP) participants, recently launched a video game tournament hosting business. Seniors at High Tech High are required to complete a "Senior Project", which is the culmination of the students' personalized academic endeavors. Students are encouraged to select projects that are in harmony with their personal goals and interests. Aaron and Victor, who were both interested in entrepreneurship, decided they wanted to start a business around their affinity for gaming as their senior project. Their senior project advisor, who was familiar with YEP, recommended they enroll in the program and take the online business training to learn how to start the business and write a business plan. After completing all lessons of the online business training, Aaron and Victor wrote a business plan for a video game tournament hosting business they named Green Mist Gaming. Their business model consists of hosting video game tournaments for teams of players of popular role playing and combat strategy video games. Green Mist Gaming charges a fee to players to enter the tournament and also sells food and refreshment. Cash prizes are given to

the winning teams. Since they had already written the business plan for their senior project, they decided to use it to enter the YEP Business Plan Competition and their plan was <u>selected as one of the top three plans</u>.

As part of the services available to them through YEP, Aaron and Victor were able to meet with a CITD Business Advisor and get assistance with fine tuning their business plan and discuss start-up specifics including permits and licenses needed, business legal structure, marketing, and more. The pair then launched their business shortly after and held their first tournament on May 25th at a venue in their high school that they were able to secure at no cost. Their first event was a success, hosting a tournament centered around the video game League of Legends. Aaron and Victor plan to pursue college degrees while continuing to work on growing their business.
