The Law of Attraction in the Bible

There are three Eternal Universal laws that must be understood so that we can apply them intentionally, effectively, and satisfactorily through our expression of life. This applies to all facets of our experience, not just Templary. As spiritual warriors, I feel compelled to visit this topic for the greater good.

The three great laws of the universe are known collectively as the Law of Attraction (LOA), and are often described as metaphysical in nature and sometimes even thought of as “New Age”.

I submit that the Law is found throughout many versions of the Bible and other religions. The law is divided into 3 parts.

First, “That Which Is Like Unto Itself Is Drawn”. It defines the most powerful law in the universe; it affects all things and nothing that exists is unaffected by this law.

Second, is the Law of Deliberate Creation or simply **“That which I give thought to and that what I believe and expect, is”.**

Third, is the Law of Allowing, which says **“I am that I am and allow all others to be that which they are.”**

I was raised a Catholic. I learned to pray as soon as I was able to talk. I learned some things about “faith” and “inspiration.” While growing up, this type of understanding or education was impressed upon me; I never learned how to conquer my monkey mind and focus on the prayers. I later discovered various texts and tapes that offered a different spin on some concepts in the bible.

The Law of Attraction is useful in using the Bible, and at times, to bounce back and forth between “church” vocabulary and the principle of the “new age” movement vocabulary.

The premise of the attraction is found dozens of times in the Bible: “Ask and ye shall receive.” The secret of the Law of Attraction says whatsoever you think about with enough emotion, you will attract to you. *Remember, thoughts are things!* Ask and it is given. This is a universal truth and it applies to everything, everywhere, at all times. The greater emotion we are feeling, the more powerful the thought is and the faster it will be manifested.

Christ taught that “perfect faith casteth out fear” (1 John 4:18), which a limiting belief, because you can’t have two beliefs (faith & fear) at the same time. To attract your desires, you must have perfect faith. That faith will have a higher vibrational state and your internal energy will raise to a new higher level kind the universe will provide to meet that vibration. Conversely, negative thoughts will attract negative circumstances and bring about what you are attracting.
