What are Roman Numerals?



A series of letters that the Romans used as their numerical system

A letter placed AFTER a greater value adds;

XVI = 10 + 5 + 1 = 16

A letter placed BEFORE a greater value *subtracts*;

What are the numerals?

I = 1

V = 5

X = 10

L = 50

C = 100

D = 500

M = 1000

XIX = 10 + (10 - 1) = 19

Here are some important Roman Numeral examples
