OVERVIEW

PCS (Publishing Control Systems) is a web-based application designed to store and keep track of important production information. It operates at the divisional/workgroup level and contains Title Specification, Design, Art Program, Scheduling, and Cost information. The data elements are used to help guide production and manufacturing users as a project moves through its lifecycle. PCS supports budgeting, scheduling and design functions for the book and media products.

1 | Log In

- 1 Launch the Safari (Mac) or Internet Explorer (PC) browser, and type the PCS URL in the address bar: **http://pcs.pearson.com/pims/**
Press **Return** on your keyboard.



Quick Tip

For PC, press **Enter** on your keyboard.

- 2 The **PCS Global Login** screen appears.
 - a Select your Domain Name (Example: **peroot**).
 - b Type your user name in the **User Name** text box. (Example: **ulastfi**)
 - c Type your password in the **Password** text box.
 - d Click the **Sign in** button.



- 1 To log out of PCS, click the **Sign Out** button.


Note

You will automatically be logged out of PCS after 1 hour of inactivity.




NOTE If PCS-only (non workflow) users click the **Dashboard** menu, the *Currently you are not set up as a Workflow user. If you are attempting to log in to an individual application, please log out and go to the direct URL for that application... warning message appears.*

- 2 If the close browser reminder message appears, click the **OK** button.



- 3 Click the browser's **Close**  button to completely close the browser window. This will ensure that you are logged out of PCS.



For PC

Click the  button.

Note

Mac users need to quit Safari to reset the 60 minute inactivity timeout limit.
