

About Product Manual Assignment

Selecting Manual Assignment allows you the flexibility to choose the product entry point for each new student. The Assignment Tables below are provided to assist you in making decisions about product assignments based on students' current grade level, prior Fast ForWord product history (if any), and educational classification (e.g., English Language Learner and/or receiving special education services). Students using the manual assignment method may take the Reading Progress Indicator (RPI) assessment. The scores from RPI should only be used to assess student achievement in the MySciLEARN Gains report.

General Guidelines

- In most cases, students should only be working on one product at a time. Select Stop on the Student Profile once the student has reached a Switch or Complete status and the next product is assigned.
- Students should not start a new product until they have reached a Switch or Complete.
- Students who begin in the Fast ForWord Language or Literacy series should complete both products before beginning work in the Fast ForWord Reading series (see Table 4 for recommendations).
