#### BHA TAKES ANABOLICS STANCE

The British Horseracing Authority unveiled its "enhanced, zero-tolerance" anabolic steroids policy Thursday, which includes a 14-month ban from

competition in Britain for any horse testing positive. The headline elements of the policy state that a horse must not be administered anabolic steroids at any point in its life, and all horses will be subject to testing at any time, regardless of physical location, once registered with Weatherbys. All British-bred horses must be registered with Weatherbys within 12 months of birth, which will be phased to six

months in two years. Any horse testing positive for anabolic steroids will be banned from training for 12 months, and from competition for 14 months. Permanently imported horses must be registered with Weatherbys within six months of arrival, accompanied by a sample that shows no evidence of anabolic steroid administration. Horses imported from Ireland, France and Germany that have spent 12 months under their equivalent policies will be exempt from this requirement, and runners from those countries will be treated as British runners and be sampled as per the standard testing policy. All other foreign runners must be in Britain a minimum of 14 days in advance of their intended race to facilitate post-arrival sampling and analysis. The BHA's new policy, which is intended to be implemented Jan. 1, 2015, is the result of a project started in 2013 that included extensive scientific research and consultation across the racing industry and externally, including sales companies, veterinary organizations, scientific experts and animal welfare charities. Scientific literature relating to therapeutic use of anabolic steroids, possible performance-enhancing effects and methods of detection were also reviewed. The project aimed to establish how British racing would not only adhere to, but exceed where possible, international minimum standards on steroid use set out by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities, which states that anabolic steroids have no place in horse racing and should not be permitted in or out of competition. The IFHA has noted that it will work with jurisdictions that may permit exceptional use for therapeutic purposes with stringent controls and a stand-down period, whereas the BHA's new policy will not allow the use of anabolic steroids under any circumstances. British trainers Mahmood Al Zarooni and Gerard Butler received lengthy bans for anabolic steroid use last year. Only eighth on the first Saturday in June, Newtown Anner Stud's homebred is unbeaten in his native country this term, with his conditioner hoping he can return to the sort of form that saw him win the Apr. 12 G3 Ballysax S. at Navan, and be promoted to first in Leopardstown's G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial S. Regarding the chances of Fascinating Rock (Ire) running Saturday, Trainer Dermot Weld said, "The plan is to go, but The Curragh needs rain or to put a lot of water on, as it is very firm. He will be declared, but whether he runs or not is another thing. I appreciate it is difficult to decide what to do, with the forecast, but I'm sure they'll get it right." Weld added: "[Fascinating Rock] got battered all over the place at Epsom, especially coming down the hill. I've done very little with him since, as I'm more interested in having him fresh on the day, but he's in very good order. He hasn't done a great piece of work, because I haven't asked him to. If he runs, I'm expecting the excellent consistent performances that he put in when he ran here in his group races in Ireland." Seamus Heffernan takes the ride on the most notable Epsom flop, lastplace finisher Geoffrey Chaucer (Montjeu {Ire}), with Michael Hussey on the G3 Chester Vase winner Orchestra (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who finished 12th in the Derby. Colm O'Donoghue completes Ballydoyle's riding arrangements on the Listed Dee S. scorer Kingfisher (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"The need for an international position that sets robust minimum standards on use of anabolic steroids in horse racing was one that was pushed by BHA and a number of other key racing jurisdictions last year and resulted in the IFHA's adopted position," said BHA Chief Executive Paul Bittar. "The enhanced, zero-tolerance policy announced today, which exceeds the international minimum standard, has the objective of ensuring that British racing remains at the forefront of tackling an issue that ranks amongst the biggest threats faced by any world sport."

Bittar added, "It is intended to ensure that the industry, racing and betting public can be reassured that all races that take place on British soil are done so on a level playing field. It is also hoped that this will be another step towards global harmonization across the sport, and that the leadership role BHA has adopted on this issue can result in those nations that have not yet adopted the minimum standards following suit. Our previous policy already met the minimum standards, and today's announcement goes further, ensuring British racing retains its pre-eminent position in respect of how drug use is regulated within the sport. After a challenging 16 months, as a result of the actions taken already by several nations, the sport globally is now in a much better place when it comes to the regulation of anabolic steroids." 

### ENHANCED SECURITY PROTOCOLS FOR STARS AND STRIPES DAY Edited Press Release

The New York State Gaming Commission and The New York Racing Association Inc. announced enhanced security protocols for horses running in the two \$1 million-plus Grade I stakes races on Stars and Stripes Day, July 5, 2014. All horses potentially participating in the \$1-million Belmont Oaks Invitational and \$1.25million Belmont Derby Invitational will be subject to out-of-competition testing and must be on the grounds by noon July 2. Trainers of horses participating in the races must provide complete veterinary records for three days leading up to the race. Additionally, horses will be monitored at all times from their arrival at the track leading up to the races.

"These protocols have proven to be effective security measures for high stakes races," said Commission Executive Director Robert Williams. "They will ensure a level playing field and ensure the integrity and transparency of the sport in New York State."

The Commission and NYRA have mandated several protocols and steps for horses participating in the two Grade I stakes races July 5, including:

The Commission will take out-of-competition blood samples of horses competing in the races and send them to the N.Y.S. Equine Drug Testing and Research Program at Morrisville State College for immediate testing.

The Commission will coordinate with other jurisdictions to obtain out-of-competition samples from horses that are not stabled in New York State.

- Horses will be monitored at all times by additional security personnel.
- Security personnel will monitor all treatments performed by veterinarians. All containers for medications administered will be retained by the Commission for possible testing.
- A full daily veterinarian's record of all medications and treatments given to horses participating in these races from Noon on July 2 until July 5 will be provided to the Commission. Any changes to treatment must be disclosed to the Commission. If medications and treatment records are not provided to the Commission prior to treatment, veterinarians will not be permitted to treat the horse until the issue is resolved. The Commission will post these records on its Web site each day leading up to the races.
- As is current policy, Lasix administration will take place in the horses' own stalls by a NYRA veterinarian. Syringes will be preserved by the Commission for possible testing.
- On July 5, no treatment will be permitted (beyond Lasix for specifically designated horses) unless it is for an emergency or as approved by the Stewards. For complete list of raceday protocol, click here.



Starspangledbanner, a multiple Group 1-winner in Australia and Britain, proved subfertile when retired to Coolmore in 2011, but has enjoyed outstanding results with his first Northern Hemisphere 2-year-olds, including Royal Ascot winners The Wow Signal

forecasting rain in Ireland, so he wouldn't get his ground," bin Suroor told *PA Sport*. "The Eclipse will be fine for him and he's going to run in a visor for the first time. We worked him in one and he worked better, so we'll try that." Prior to the Investec Derby, True Story finished third behind subsequent G1 Prix du Jockey Club winner The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) as favorite in the May 15 G2 Dante S. at York.

### 2014 SCHEDULE SET FOR PALACE MALICE

Last year's GI Belmont S. hero **Palace Malice** (Curlin), victorious in the June 7 GI Met Mile, joined Todd Pletcher's Saratoga string Tuesday after recording a final work at Belmont last Sunday. The 4-year-old, who will get a short freshening before embarking on a summer/fall campaign, completed an easy half-mile in :50 4/5. According to a Dogwood Stable's release, the Classic winner will make four more starts in 2014: Saratoga's GI Whitney Invitational Aug. 2 and GI Woodward Aug. 30; the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont; and the GI Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita. He is expected to have five more works at Saratoga before the Whitney.

### DIRT MILE BERTH ON THE LINE IN CHILE

Nine of Chile's best horses will bid for a starting position in the \$1-million G1 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in the G2 Clasico Copa de Oro Breeders' Cup S. today at Club Hipico de Santiago. The 1 1/8-mile race, to be run over the Club Hipico right-handed dirt course, is one of 11 new Challenge series races, and is also the last of four South American races in this year's series. The field is led by Stud Kekita's Papelon (Chi) (Monthir), four-time winner of the G1 Clasico Club Hipico de Santiago on turf, and Haras Don Albertoïs homebred Bronzo (Chi) (Fusaichi Pegasus), winner of the last renewal of the G1 Gran Premio Hipodromo Chile, the nation's premiere race on dirt. The field has also attracted 2011 G1 Club Hipico de Santiago hero Sin Respeto (Chi) (Caesarion {Ire}), last year's Copa de Oro runner-up Bum Bum Chiquibum (Chi) (Camp David), Hipodromo Chile runner-up Turco Bravo (Chi) (Caesarion (Ire), multiple Group 3 winner Besa Cat (Chi) (Cat Scan) and G1 El Derby runner-up Aire Bueno (Chi) (Ivan Denisovich {Ire}).

# feeback

In Thursday's TDN, we ran an op/ed by Bill Finley, "Drugs = Fewer Starts = Less Money for the Owner" (click here) which elicited the following responses.

### **BILL CASNER:**

Mr. Finley has done a very good job of letting the data show that medication has decreased the number of annual and lifetime starts of racehorses and if you will read a bit further, you will understand why.

Three years ago, my trainer Eoin Harty installed scales in his barns and started weighing horses. Both of us wanted to truly understand what was happening to horses running with and without Lasix. We have always been told that horses will lose around 25 pounds. of fluid when administered Lasix. While this may be true for the first four hours, the diuresis continues long after the horse has run. The literature states that the diuretic effect will last up to 72 hours. We weighed the horses the morning of the race prior to Lasix and then weighed them the morning after. What we found was beyond all expectations. The weights of the horses the following morning were any where from 30 pounds to 100 pounds less than the prior morning. While a 100 pounds was the exception, the filly that lost that much, won her race and only received 3cc's of Lasix. She was a big filly that weighed around 1200 pounds and it took her nearly six weeks to fully recover the weight. The average weight loss for most horses is between 35 and 55 pounds and can vary with the amount of Lasix administered and the temperature. The highest dose of Lasix that was given was 5cc's. I can only imagine what happens to those poor horses receiving 10cc's. Also keep in mind that these weight losses were after the horses had consumed two to 2 1/2 buckets by the following morning. To put that in context, that is 80 to a 100 pounds of water (one gallon weighs eight pounds) yet these horses were significantly behind the weight curve. Horses that did not run on Lasix lost only three to eight pounds the following morning and had generally fully recovered their weight within two or three days. It was after weighing these horses over a couple of months that I made the decision that my horses would no longer run on Lasix. I began to understand how violent the stress was that these horses were undergoing post race. We witness it on hot days when they are returning to the grandstand after they have run.

Our horses have now run for 2 1/2 years without Lasix and bute with around 150 horse starts. The number of horses that we have that bleed is around 5-6%. Of those that have bled, we have always found an underlying pathology, generally an inflammatory airway issue, that precipitated the bleed. After treating those horses and clearing up the problem, to date EVERY HORSE HAS RUN BACK and NONE HAVE BLED. Horses bleed because they live in filthy, dusty environments and we employ ways to reduce that exposure. Most people that read this will not believe it but you can ask Eoin or any of his assistants and they will verify. It has been eye opening for all of us and has been the result of using novel methods and making a concerted effort to provide those horses with the cleanest possible respiratory environment that is possible. Phenylbutazone is also a major contributor. It is not even used in human medicine anymore because of its implication with leukemia. It is an NSAID that interferes with clotting and at the very least will exasperate a bleed. Isn't is coincidental that Bute was our first approved medication and then a few years later along comes the flexible endoscope and we discover horses are bleeding? What is ironic, is that bute has lost virtually all of its analgesic effect after 24 hours, but its negative effect on platelets last for 72 hours. So many horses get it, not because they need it, but 'just in case' and of course, because you can.

Our win percentage is around 16% per *Equibase*. While not the coveted 20%, I will take it. I am very proud of Eoin Harty and his team and what they have accomplished. They have been willing to question the 'conventional rhetoric' and we have found the truth. Healthy horses that live in well managed respiratory environments do not bleed and run extremely well without medication. They pull up good, are in the tub, are kicking squealing the next morning and we are looking for races for them in two weeks. I am also very proud to employ a trainer in Eoin Harty that has NEVER HAD A MEDICATION VIOLATION in the 14 years that he has had a trainer's license.

As to the competitive advantage I may be giving up, we reap the benefits of having sounder healthier horses that can run more often and have longer careers and I don't have to apologize for not practicing what I advocate. Yes, it can be done.

### **GARY S. BROAD:**

Bill, I am so glad that you wrote this article, maybe some owners will finally just say no to trainers giving there horses these drugs. Let them run drug free.

There is a study done in Europe that showed that horses improve by three to five lengths with Lasix. I believe it was co-written by the same veterinarian that did the South African study that trainers always point to as proof that Lasix works. Keep up the good stories you are writing. Hopefully, it might make a difference.

#### **GEORGE THOMPSON:**

Bill Finley's Op/Ed in the June 26, 2014, issue of Thoroughbred Daily News "Drugs = Fewer Starts = Less Money for the Owner" is spot on, and even better provides supporting data. To date all I've seen is anecdotal evidence from an owner or two determined to see for himself. One of them noted that it took his horses on average 30 days to recover from a race-day dose of Lasix. That's just to recover from the weight loss. Since Lasix is a diuretic, most of that lost weight is body fluid. Some years back I looked into the matter of why there still have been no Triple Crown winners since Affirmed (1978). One thing that stood out was that, from what I could find, none of those champions raced with the benefit of Lasix. If it takes 30 days to recover from a doped race, then five weeks between the Triple Crown races is the minimum time needed. So either revise the stakes schedule accordingly or kick the Lasix addiction.

### **ELIZABETH BLYTHE:**

This is a great article and service to the industry by Bill Finley, graphically illustrating when and why U. S. starts per runner, per year have declined. You can see it for yourself in the DRF publication 'Champions" which contains the lifetime past performances of all divisional champions/Eclipse Award winners from 1893-2004. Even the best of the best show a sharp drop in lifetime and annual starts coinciding with the universal use of Lasix. It is readily apparent that the idea that the Thoroughbred of today has become 'weak & fragile' due to a genetic decline, just doesn't hold water IF you consider the performance of North American foaled runners abroad in countries that DO NOT allow raceday medication. The same genes and raising here compete at the highest levels globally, however, the U.S. obsession with 'dirt type' physical specimens has led to a decline in availability of the type of individual suitable for predominantly turf racing on natural, undulating surfaces found in most of Europe.

We only need look at the success of America's two most dominant and popular young sires, War Front and Tapit. They are both outstanding, but the former has excelled in Europe, so far.

So, when American-breds that suit the racing conditions in countries that do not permit raceday medications go to these places, they are fully capable of performing against their peers without these 'crutches,' and able to run back much more frequently.

I find it encouraging Arapahoe Park is offering a bonus incentive for owners and trainers who stable and run there free of medication. The time has come for other tracks to follow suit, but take it a step further. In black-type races, you can run on medication for the purse, but the black type is only awarded to any medication free first through third finishers.

It is a sad fact the majority of trainers (and some owners) here in the States have never known any other way to train and race their horses than with medication. But it can be done! Step up, show the courage to lead the way.

### KY Downs to Offer \$1 Million a Day in Purses:

The 2014 Kentucky Downs live all-turf racing season will feature record purses in excess of \$1 million per card for each of its five days, the track announced vesterday. The five-day meet kicks off Saturday, Sept. 6, with full cards set for Wednesday, Sept. 10, Saturday, Sept. 13, Wednesday, Sept. 17 and Wednesday, Sept. 24. "More than \$1 million in daily purse structure will make 2014 a breakout year for Kentucky Downs," said Kentucky Downs President Corey Johnsen. "I believe that record purse money combined with a world class turf course will attract many of North America's horses, jockeys and trainers. We have also slightly modified our stakes schedule to mirror many of the distances in this year's Breeders' Cup." The signature event of the track's 23rd meet is the \$600,000 GIII Kentucky Turf Cup, up from \$400,000 in 2013. Presented Sept. 13, the one and one-half mile race anchors Kentucky Downs' Million Day, which also features four stakes used as stepping stones to this season's Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, including the \$200,000 Kentucky Downs Ladies Turf. All races and stakes have received increases due to the matching funds support from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF). The \$150,000 stakes races run in 2013 are now \$200,000; each allowance race will offer \$100,000 and purses of \$90,000 will be offered for 2-year-old maiden special weight events.

### Romans, Musselman Involved in Altercation:

Trainer Dale Romans and Eddie Musselman, responsible for the backside racetrack publication Indian Charlie, were involved in a physical altercation on the Churchill Downs backstretch Thursday morning, reports The Louisville Courier-Journal. The Louisville Metro Police Department was reportedly called following the incident and the matter has been turned over to the authorities, according to Churchill spokesman John Asher. Musselman, whose publication was recently banned from being distributed on the grounds of several racetracks and sales facilities, had penned a scathing attack on the Eclipse Award-winning trainer in last week's instalment of the paper, which allegedly prompted the fight. Exercise rider Tammy Fox, Romans's longtime partner and mother of his children, was reportedly on hand for the altercation and allegedly involved in the incident. Musselman told Courier-Journal he sustained a black eve, but did not have to go to a doctor. A spokesperson for the LMP indicated she was unaware of any criminal charges having been filed with the department.
