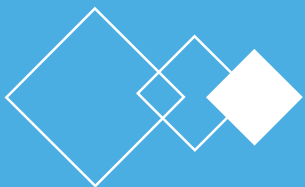

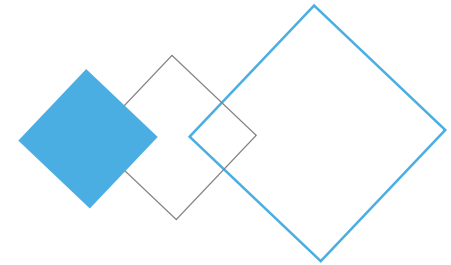

OUR VALUES



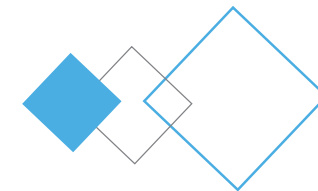

HISTORY OF IHCRO

IHCRO was founded in 2014 by group a of young Muslims living in Istanbul Turkey as there was an immense need in charity works in Syria. This are the times of Syrian war that hundreds of thousands of people died and displaced from their lands. Musab Turkmen and Kuwaiti national Abdulla-teef Khalid decided to establish IHCRO humanitarian aid organization so as to help Syrian refugees in Turkey and Syrian Muslims living in Syria territory. Musab and Abdullateef realized that orphans of the Syrian war are the most victimized ones of all needies. For that reason, IHCRO have been mainly focusing on caring of orphans for four years.

Immediately after the foundation of IHCRO, One Solid Ummah humanitarian team in Syria and IHCRO humanitarian organization agreed on to work together in Syria. From that time till now, IHCRO completed tens of projects and campaigns in various sizes. The orphan village projects started in 2015 with the building of orphan village-1 in Atmah. After that, second and third orphan villages were added as an extension to this project. As coming to 2017, Kuwait Al Khair project started and successfully finished. In this project, two villages were constructed with respectively 12 and 24 prefabricated houses. Simultaneously with this project, orphan village-6 which is namely "House of Hommoud" was initiated and mostly sponsored by a generous Kuwaiti family and was carried out by IHCRO and OSU. In 2018, "Emergency Shelter Village" Project was started for 50 displaced families of Ghouta and south Syria and mostly completed during the first half or the year. In the second half of the 2018, two big project was initiated, which are orphan village-8 and Saud Faisal Al-Musallam's Medical Clinic. During its four year lifetime IHCRO have joined more than 20 masjids and 15 wells projects of One Solid Ummah. From the beginning of Syrian war, Alhamdulillah, IHCRO and OSU have organized tens of campaigns by their successful local team and reached thousands of Muslims in Syria.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECT MANAGER

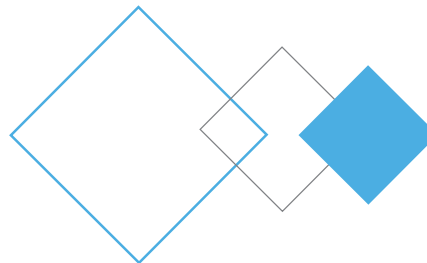

PROJECTS

ORPHAN VILLAGE-1

In between the olive trees of Shaam, there stands a village that was built with utmost precision, dedication and respect for families who have suffered war. Our hope is that the best generation will be raised here. A tranquil glimpse into our village 1 project. Homes that were built with our heart, sacrifice and compassion.

Achievements of OSU are not solely in the walls and homes which are built but in the hearts OSU build. While many children suffer mental and emotional anxiety, the children in OSU villages recover faster than ever here Alhamdulillah. Two things break them here: rockets & poverty! So, every village we build is meant to remove children from conflict zones and then provide them a secure and comfortable place. For those who know Syria, its all heartache here, in every sense. But within our walls, we control our atmosphere. No disunity, hate or selfishness. We build the values of brotherhood, love, faith and courage. We teach about caring for one another while bearing our struggle with dignity and patience.

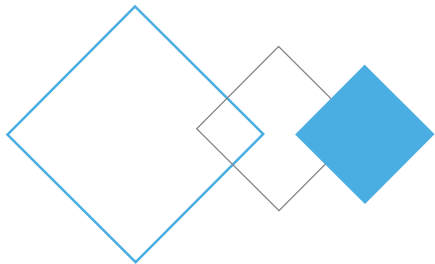
Within the scope of this project, 40 houses (20 apartment), a masjeed, a school, a small clinic, an admin building, a super market, a gym center, recreation areas, a playground were constructed in a wall secured area with all infrastructure systems. We started this project in August 2015 and completed it in October 2016 Alhamdulillah.

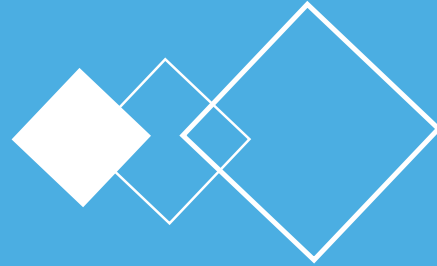


ORPHAN VILLAGE-2

After finishing our flagship project, OSU orphan village-1, in early 2016, we decided to add a smaller extension village to provide more homes for orphan families. UK based charity group "Muslims In Need" was particularly interested in taking part in this project, so we bought a 2,500m² land and built 18 homes and 1 masjid together. Remarkably and praise be to Allah, we built these homes from scratch between April 2016 till October 2016, in just 6 months. We care about quality so much so that we make sure that our all contributions go to providing the children with the best.

Since it is very close to our orphan village 1 community, the children have opportunity to benefit from our Abu Bakr Al-Sideeq School and Quran learning in Masjid Al-Sahabah which is less than 2 min walk. In addition to these, they can benefit from clinic, market, playgrounds and sport center as well.

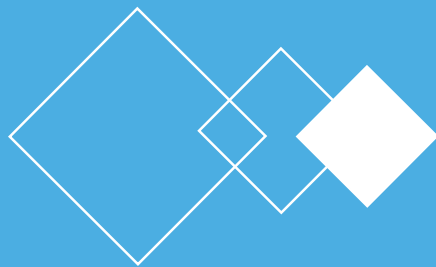




ORPHAN VILLAGE-3

Orphan Village-3 is the additional small building complex which IHCRO and OSU built next to the orphan village 1 and 2 with the intention of providing more families opportunity to benefit from services granted in orphan village-1. We started this project in August 2017 and completed it in November 2017 Alhamdulillah. Within the scope of this project, 3 apartment (In total 6 houses) were constructed.

In between the hundred of thousands of displaced people living in tents inside Northern Syria (near Turkey), IHCRO and OSU community have built hundreds of quality homes for orphans of war and their mothers so they can live in safety and dignity.



ORPHAN VILLAGE 4 & 5

Welcome to our "Kuwait al-Khair" orphan village which we built from scratch inside Syria. The quality of what we offer is a reflection of the quality & sincerity of love we have for them. This is just one of the many villages we have built for orphans Alhamdulillah.

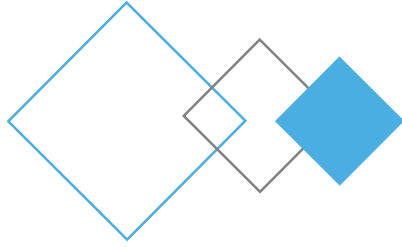
Orphan Village-4 and 5, namely Kuwait AlKhayr, is one of beloved projects of IHCR community. This project specifically focused on offering a village to smaller orphan families (2 children). All our other villages cater bigger families (3-8 children). This one includes 36 Pre-fabricated houses ordered from Turkey, 24 for Orphan Village-4 and 12 for Orphan Village 5.



ORPHAN VILLAGE- 4 & 5

We built this project on 5,000m2 land from scratch between January to May 2017 in Syria. More than 100 orphans and widows reside here. Like all our projects, we offer 24 hours security, schooling, supermarket, masjid & Quran school and playground. Everything is provided for free such as electricity, water, education, clothing, medical support and monthly salary Alhamdulillah by the support of OSU community.

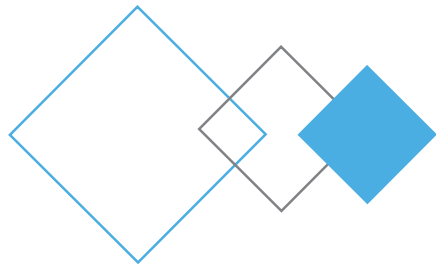




ORPHAN VILLAGE-6

When the homes of children were destroyed, we dedicated our lives to building them a new one. AN ENTIRE VILLAGE...A DREAM LAND...Just for orphans of war. The photos you see is a reflection of the size & quality of the love in our hearts. Everyone grows up with a dream of building a mansion for themselves but we IHCRO have dream to build homes for orphans of war who saw nothing in their lives but blood, bombs and poverty.

Our biggest project till date is "Bayt Humoud" (Orphan Village 6) is a one of a kind orphanage that includes 40 homes, school, masjid, supermarket, clinic, playground and kindergarten and 2 wells. It has a huge garden and like all our other villages, we IHCRO community offer them free home, food, water & electricity, schooling, Quran learning & great upbringing with the help of Allah(swt). We started this project in March 2017 and finished it in November 2017 Alhamdulillah.

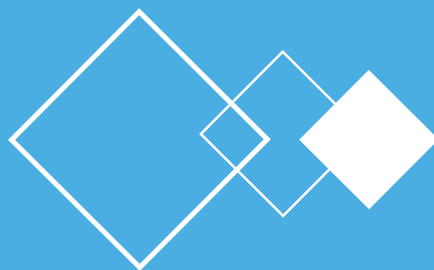


EMERGENCY SHELTER VILLAGE

Syrian war has left thousands of people displaced. Many people left their homes behind and went to relatively secure places like Turkey-Syria borders in Idlib. Normally, we IHCRO, with our local partner OSU, build just orphan villages inside the Syria. However, because of increased necessities of the migrated people, we decided to build a shelter village at the end of 2017. In January of 2018, we started to build this emergency shelter village and we mostly finished it in June 2018 Alhamdulillah.

By building this shelter village, our aim was to take care of the poor and forgotten families fleeing from bombs and destruction, especially from East Ghouta which is a neighborhood area of Damascus. Inshallah, this village will host 50 displaced families for many years. In addition to these homes, there exist a prayer hall, a supermarket, an admin office and a garden/playground within the scope of this project.

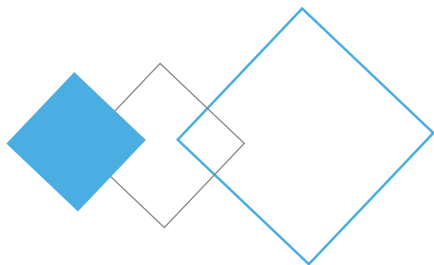
This emergency shelter village was built in a short period of time so as to serve displaced families as soon as possible. It is our first project which aims needs other than orphan families.



ORPHAN VILLAGE-8

After finishing the Emergency Shelter Village in June 2018, we decided to build a new orphan village so as to take care of more orphan families. We started this new project in July 2018, immediately after the finish of Emergency Shelter Village. This is the 8th village of IHCRO and OSU community in Syria. Partnering up with MuslimsInNeed (UK) and Merciful Group (Australia), we aimed to provide quality housing for more than 200 orphan children who have lost their fathers in the Syrian crisis. The project aims at sheltering, educating and providing ongoing care and guidance. We will be teaching Quran as well as having many recreational activities for the children within our built-in playground. There will be running water, electricity and all major services within the village inshaAllah.

Within the scope of this project, our target is to build 50 quality homes all of which will be furnished. Inside the village, there will be also a lovely playground, a recreation hall and a village-centered masjid/quran school. All the infrastructures like deep water well, electric generator and solar panels, sewage system and etc. will be in plan Alhamdulillah. Orphan Village 8 is situated meters away from our Orphan Village-6, whereby the children will be able to attend school in that village.



MEDICAL CENTER

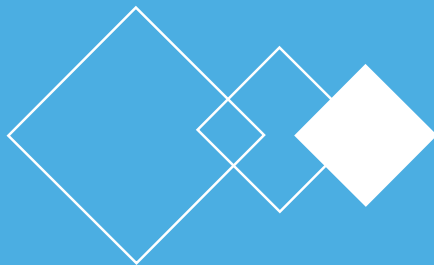
We decided to build this clinic after a dear friend of ours Saud Faisal Al Musallam passed away in Ramadan 2018 and we wanted a sadaqah jariya for him. Only 3 months later, a beautiful medical clinic was launched in his name. InshaAllah hundreds and thousands of children & their families will be treated here as we leave behind this project for generations to come.

WHY THIS PROJECT IS REQUIRED?

Medical center is one of the primary needs of the Syrian Muslims in Idlib. According to estimates more than three million people are living in Idlib and there are a lot of internal refugees who has came from all around the Syria. On the one hand, rapidly growing needy population and on the other hand destruction or being damaged of many hospitals by brutal Syrian Regime and Russia, necessity of the people to a medical center has increased substantially. The necessity of a medical center is immense especially for children and women.

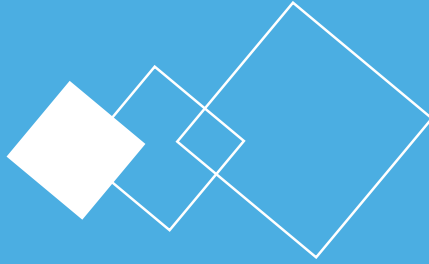
PROJECT DETAILS

Within the scope of this project, office of admission hall, pharmacy room, short stay room for children, short stay room for women, clinic, 3 short stay unit, 2 administrative room, waiting room, rest room, childbirth room, radiology room and etc. were constructed



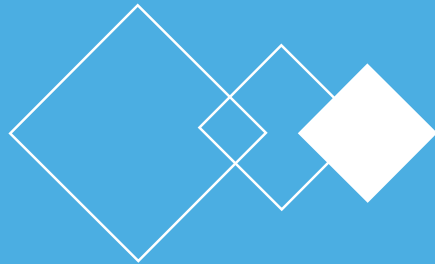

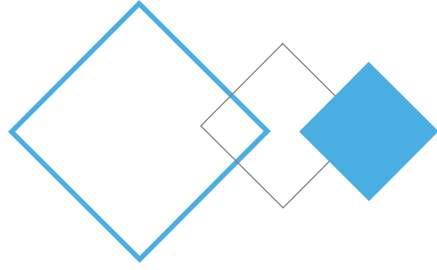




WATER WELL PROJECTS

Water scarcity is one of the primal problems in war zones. Other than lack of drinking water, people encounter with epidemic illnesses and severe hygiene problems. IHCRO community have built more than 15 wells in Syria so far by coming donations. For an orphan village, a well is a dire necessity, so we have constructed wells to all our large orphan villages. Other than orphan villages, some wells were constructed inside the towns of Syria. A well named Dr. Abdulrahman Al-Sumait (rahimahuAllah) is one of the deepest one of our wells. This was a huge project because it's a deep well where we dug to 550 meters to extract water Alhamdulillah. By constructing deep wells like this one, we are aiming to serve water to needy people throughout the year.





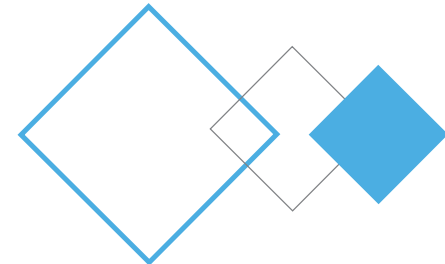
REFUGEE ORPHANEGES

While we've built many orphan villages inside Syria Alhamdulillah, we also work hard helping Syrian orphan refugees in Turkey. This is one of our orphanages we've established. It is called AHALINA ORPHANAGE. Ahalina in Arabic means "Our Family". Imagine being an orphan and hearing that name before moving in. 16 families and nearly 60 orphan will have a home in these building inshaAllah

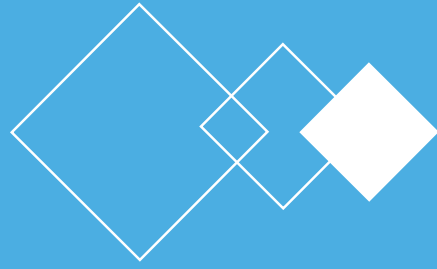


ORPHAN BUILDING COMPLEX

This is our orphan building complex, one of the stand-alone projects. There are six houses inside and we are expecting it accomodates more than 30 orphans. The building is just a minute walk from our orphan village-1 and wall to wall with our OSU Bakery.

1-Abu Bakr Siddiq(r.a.) School

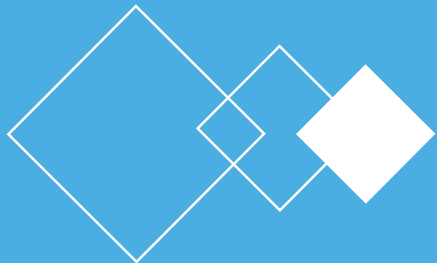
Abu Bakr Siddiq school is located in Orphan Village-1 and serves the orphans of first three villages. This is the first school OSU built and the biggest of all. We named it with the name of the beloved friend of Rusullullah (a.s.) and first Khalifa Ebu Bakr As-Siddiq (r.a).

2-Khalid Ibn Al-Waliyd(r.a.) School

Khalid Ibn Al-Waliyd school is located in Kuwait Al-Khayr orphan village and serves the orphans of fourth and fifth villages. This is the second school of OSU and we named it with the name of the greatest warrior and the commander of the history of Islam and one of the closest friends of Rasullullah(s.a.w.).

3-Salahuddiyn Ayyubi School

Salahuddiyn Ayyubi school is located in 6th orphan village (Bayt Hamood) and serves the orphans of 6th and 8th villages. This is the third school of OSU. We named it with the great hero and the prominent leader of Islamic History.

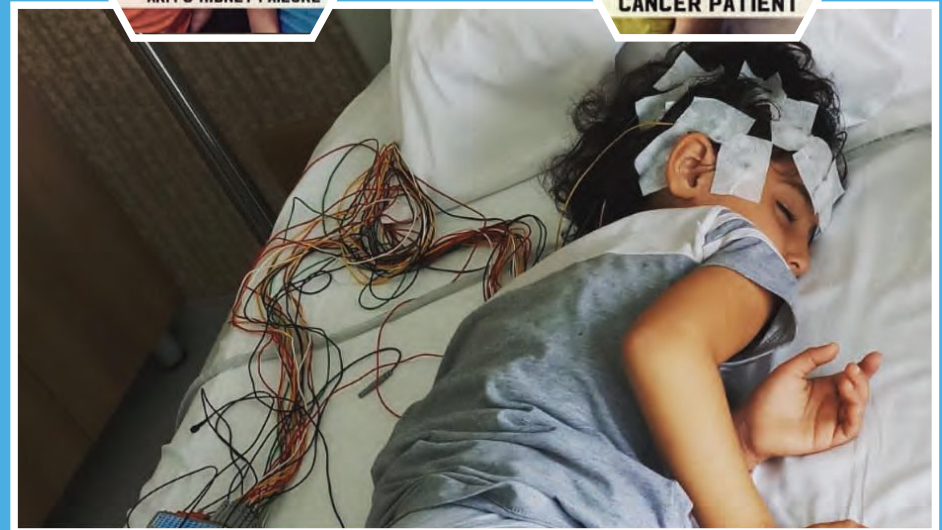
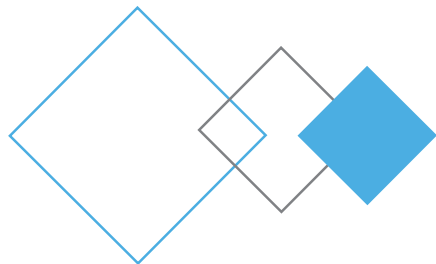
1- GENERAL DONATION CAMPAIGN

Campaign Info

IHRCO have various charity activities for needy Muslim people in all around the world. This campaign aims to prioritize the necessities of the needy people and provides them what exactly they need. Needs of the poor people could be various type. Therefore this campaign includes the following type of charity activities and many more:

- 1- Helping orphans and sick children
- 2- Food bags and hand donation distribution
- 3- Providing health services to sick and disabled children
- 4- Masjids construction and well digging
- 5- Clothes, toys and etc. distribution

2- ORPHAN VILLAGE SUPPORT

Campaign Info

Constructing orphan villages and sustaining them is one of the foremost working areas of IHCRO and One Solid Ummah. By the donations of generous supporters, IHCRO and OSU has constructed six orphan villages in Idlib, Syria so far with their partner organizations and one more village is on the way. Currently, there are more than 150 orphan families are living in those villages and beside those villages we have one orphanage and an orphan building complex. We are steadily increasing the numbers of orphans that we are caring. Our responsibilities for these orphans are not over by just building their homes. The sustainment of these villages is our current and ongoing mission.

The scope of the sustainment work contains:

- 1-Diesel fuel to run electricity for all the homes and
- 2-pump water from the wells to homes,
- 3-Monthly food bags and daily bread service,
- 4-Operating 3 schools with over 600 children enrolled,
- 5-Guards to keep villages safe at night,
- 6-Quran school team of teachers,
- 7-Cleaning personnel dedicated to waste collection,
- 8-Household maintenance, broken and wear & tear replacement,
- 9-Providing orphans with proper clothing throught the year,
- 10-Transportation for widows and orphans to areas of public transportation,
- 11-Medical expenses and medicine for more than 1000 children under our care,
- 12-Giving hand donations to orphan families, and many more...



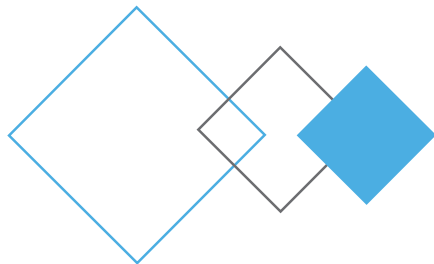
3- ORPHAN SPONSORSHIP

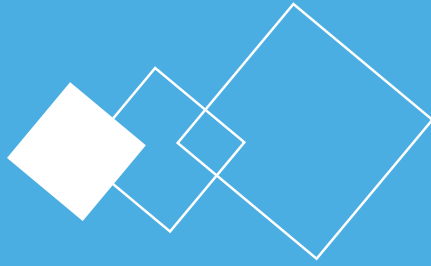
Campaign Info

Undoubtedly, childrens are the most victimized ones of the atrocities took place in crisis areas. As an illustration, in Syria war started at 2011, many children have been killed so far ferociously by the most fatal bombs and many more have fled from their land to the relatively secure regions without his/her father or any parent. According to UNICEF estimates, as many as one million children have been orphaned in Syria from the beginning of war till the end of 2017. This is a huge number to grasp such that even some countries have this much population. We, as a Muslim Ummah, are tremendously responsible for taking care of all our orphans. They are the children of our brothers and sisters and they are the "amanah" of Allah (swt). Therefore, orphan sponsorship is one of the core relief activities of IHCRO. The persistence in this service has a dire importance, since those orphans are completely dependent to help of others.

How It Works?

You donate whatever amount you want, we accumulate these donations and give them to orphan families inside/outside or our villages by hand. We are giving each orphan \$ 50 for one month. We have seven orphan villages, one orphanage and one orpha building complex in just Syria and we are expanding.





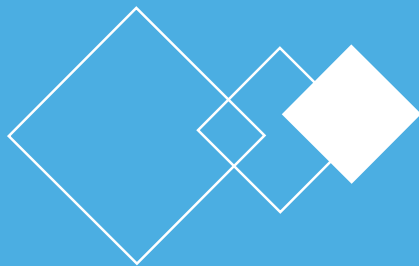
4- HOLY SACRIFICE

Campaign Info

Holy sacrifice is a religious duty for rich Muslims and there are some different type of it like aqiqah, adaq(vow), sacrifice for Iyd Al-Ahda. Aqiqah and adaq sheeps could be sacrificed any time, but Iyd Al Ahda sacrifices could only be performed during its time.

How It Works?

We happily deal with your holy sacrifice "qurbani" donation request. You tell us what type of "qurbani" you want to perform like aqiqah, adaq(vow), sacrifice for Iyd Al-Ahda and etc. and send the donation. We purchase the sheep and sacrifice it on behalf of you in Syria. Then we distribute the meat to needies, especially orphans.






5- WINTER APPEAL

Campaign Info

Winters are difficult times for poor Muslims. Many people in Syria are living in tents and they feel the cold water deeply. When stormy weathers, their tents might collapse or rainwater flood inside. They, especially children and elders, get sick. They need fuel(gas) to heat their homes, winter clothes, tents, medical support, food and etc.

How It Works?

During the early periods of the winter, IHCRO opens the winter appeal campaign in various platforms. You donate whatever amount you want during the campaign time. We analyze the situation and decide whatever is necessary, then we distribute the most necessary goods like fuel, clothes, tents, food and etc. to poor families.



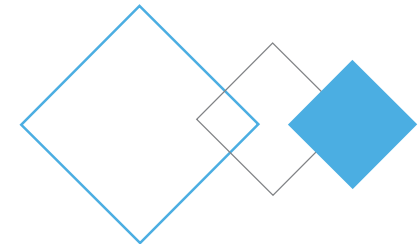
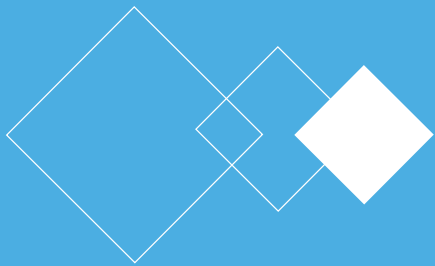
6- FOOD PACKAGE DISTRIBUTION

Distributing food packages to poor people is one the main campaign activities of IHCRO and OSU. Distributing food packages is a traditional charity activity that aims to provide needy families weekly/monthly basic food supplies. Many charity organizations performs this campaign during the Ramadan. We are performing this both in the Ramadan and throughout the year in our Orphan Villages and the outside.

How It Works?

Sometimes we start campaign for food package distribution and everyone can involve to this campaign during the campaign period. Other than campaign times, our donators can also donate "Support Orphan Villages" or "General Donations" campaigns and inform us. In this case we also prepare food packages and deliver them to the needies on behalf of them.



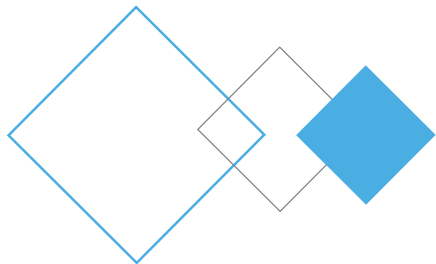
7-RAMADAN KITCHEN

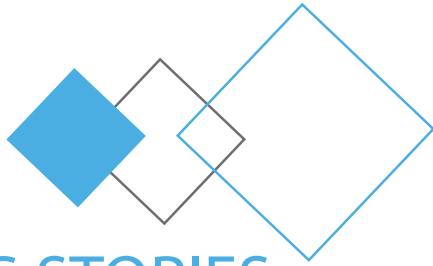
Campaign Info

Ramadan Kitchen is the popular Ramadan campaign of IHCRO and OSU, which is organized for the poor Syrian Muslims ever since 2014. We'll be cooking & distributing IFTAR meals to Syrian families everyday in the blessed month. Our meals are unique because we provide quality cooked food with meat or chicken, wrapped, and delivered hot with our own hands Alhamdulillah. All the meals will be distributed by OSU hands to most needy and poor families living in the most difficult conditions without much support.

How It Works?

When the blessed month Ramadan approaches, we open the Ramadan Kitchen campaign and collect your donations until the end of the Ramadan. We announce the cost of per meal given to poor people and you donate whatever amount you want. Meals are prepared in our own kitchens every day and then distributed to the needy people before the iftar.





TOUCHING STORIES

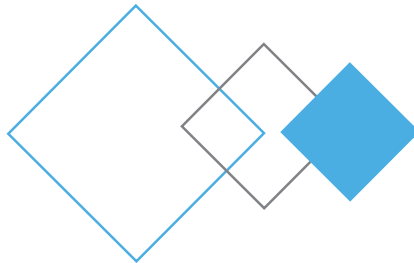
