Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) Exam

The Florida Legislature found that it was necessary in the interest of public health and safety to regulate the practice of engineering in the state of Florida. The Florida Board of Professional Engineers (FBPE) is responsible for reviewing applications, administering examinations, licensing qualified applicants, and regulating the practice of engineering throughout the state.

The FE Exam is one of the requirements to obtain your professional engineering license. (These exams are overseen and administrated by the Florida Board of Professional Engineers and NOT the University of Central Florida or the College of Engineering & Computer Science.)

Basic Information:

- The exam takes place twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall.
- The registration deadline is **SIX MONTHS** before the actual exam.
- The FE Exam is **REQUIRED** for Civil, Construction, Environmental, and Industrial Engineering majors.
