Did You Know?

For every \$1million spent with Black businesses, 10 jobs are added to the business; 7 go to Blacks.

Every \$1 million of Black Business revenue adds \$3.1 million to total US output and 25 jobs to the economy.

Nationally, Black businesses operate in neighborhoods that are 44% black; 35% operate in high poverty areas.

In Georgia, only \$6 out of every \$100 is spent with Black businesses.

There are 22 states in which Blacks are the largest minority group: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, **Georgia**, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia and Wisconsin. (Note: Minorities are part of a group other than single-race non-Hispanic white.)

The Chinese New Year, Lunar Year 4706, Year of the Rat, officially began on February 7, 2008. It is the longest and most important celebration in the Chinese Calendar.
