HURRICANE HARVEY RELIEF

On Friday, August 25th, Houston and surrounding cities faced one of the most catastrophic hurricanes to hit our community in many years. With more than 50 inches of rain in a 48-hour period, Houstonians experienced incredibly devastating flooding.

BGCGH staff responded immediately by doing what we always have - supporting youth and families by providing a safe haven with impactful programs.

 On Friday, September 1st, we opened five of our Clubs, and opened four more on Labor Day, Monday, September 4th. This gave over 400 parents and families the time to recover and go back to work knowing that their children were in a safe, happy environment since schools were closed that week.

- We served over 100 youth daily in pop-up Clubs at the NRG Center shelter throughout September.
- In addition to waiving the membership fee for our programming, we provided food and water, clothing, school supplies, shoes, and games for our families.




Rebuilding the Stafford Boys & Girls Club

• We began repairing Clubs damaged by Hurricane Harvey so that we could continue to serve Greater Houston's youth most in need, including our Stafford Club, which completely flooded and lost all of its furniture, equipment, vans and supplies.
