PERMISSIONS BASICS: A


GUIDE FOR RESEARCHERS

Use this one-page guide to determine when to request permission to use a figure or table in your manuscript, as well as when and how to provide attribution for use. Examples are included.

USE OF AN ORIGINAL FIGURE OR TABLE

If you created a figure or table specifically for the work being submitted, this is an original, and no permissions are required.

For example, the figure (to the right) is completely new and was published in the June 2018 issue of *Widgets Today* by Jay Brown.



USE OF A REPRODUCED FIGURE OR TABLE

If a figure is reproduced in a new publication exactly as it appeared in the original publication, then it is reproduced. Permission must be given by the publisher, and attribution to the original source must be provided.



USE OF AN ADAPTED FIGURE OR TABLE

If a figure is adapted, it is modified from its original appearance but still closely resembles the original. Permission must be given by the publisher, and attribution to the original source must be provided.


