

Stage 1 Module Registration

All single and joint honours programmes in economics will require you to register for the following core modules in economics:

Module Code	Module Title	Credits	Term
• EC304	Principles of Economics	30	Autumn & Spring
• EC305	Mathematics for Economics (Mode A)	15	Autumn
or EC306	Mathematics for Economics (Mode B)	15	Autumn
• EC309	Statistics for Economics	15	Spring

EC305 - You should register for this module if you have studied A-level maths or equivalent

EC306 - You should register for this module if you have **not** studied A-level maths or equivalent

The above modules contribute 60 Credits to the 120 Credits studied at Stage 1. You will automatically be enrolled on EC304 and EC309, however, you **must** register for EC305/EC306 following the guidelines above.

Single honours students will also be automatically registered on EC314 Data Analysis for Economists. The remaining 45 Credits should be chosen from the list of wild/elective modules offered by the School of Economics and/or other academic schools.

Joint honours students will be automatically registered on core modules from their other subject area. On some programmes there may be an opportunity to register for wild modules.

You should have an equal balance of Credits (60) between the Autumn and Spring terms. You cannot register for more than 120 Credits.
