- 1 That permission be granted to Mr. Pentell to erect a projecting verandah 2'6" out with eave throats all around and no posts, at the south East corner of Prior Street and Gore Av. subject to removal at any time when notified.
- 2 That D. Oppenheimer be requested to state what portion of Westminster Av he wishes to have covered with belmums.
- 3 That neither Messrs Scott & Hughes, nor Bailey & Co. be permitted to erect buildings covered with corrugated iron within the fire limits.
- 4 That the Street Inspector be instructed to put down a 3 plank walk on the north side of Lender Street between Thurlow & Duke Streets.
- 5 That the repairing of the lane in Block S. Ch. I be referred to the Street Inspector for attention.
- 6 That the Street Inspector arrange for the Chain gang to be sent to grade the lane in Block 93. 196, also to make an approach to W. H. Stevens' Stable Lot 7, Block 320. 526, from 7th Av.
- 7 That the Communication from Davis Macdick and Macneill in reference to the Claim of the Pl. Pottery & Terra Cotta Co be referred to the City Solicitor.
- 8 That the Street Inspector put down a 3 plank sidewalk on 9th Av. between the Westminster Road and Westminster Av and also a sidewalk on 8th Av from Westminster Road across the gutter about 150 ft.
