This is traditionally not an easy subject for us, and the society about us waffles between being prudish and reluctant to being exploitive and brazen. It is difficult to arrive at a faith position that both upholds the goodness of our God-given sexuality and also provides the parameters within which our sexuality should be expressed.

In 90 minutes we will certainly not exhaust this subject, but we can provide a forum for the sharing of our own stories and understandings. I encourage you to take up this invitation, perhaps with some reluctance, to join in this conversation with others who make up this faith community. We do not seek a coerced uniformity but rather an exploration of the diversity that exists within our faith family. Multiple opportunities will be offered on different days at different times, and hopefully you will be able to arrange your schedule to spend this 90 minutes with the good folk of St. John's Church. TEN FOR NINETY

In response to the survey of the congregation in late 2005, we will be scheduling multiple opportunities to meet in groups of 10 each for the purpose of exploring our understandings of human sexuality. Each session will be 90 minutes in length, hence our "Ten for Ninety". These sessions will be led by Pastor John Krueger.

It is important that we as a Christian community provide a "sanctuary," a safe place where we can talk about difficult and/or controversial issues in an atmosphere of honesty and mutual respect, honoring opinions and conclusions that are different from our own. This kind of discussion is difficult in families, certainly in our society, and we seek to be a receptive community in which this can happen. Our topic will be human sexuality and more specifically homosexuality. We will listen to each other as we share our own experiences and learning, seeking to broaden and deepen our understanding of this complex subject. Your participation is important to us all. Couples will be encouraged to attend separate sessions to broaden the stories we will hear and the insights we will have learned.

We are offering many different times in the hope that everyone will have an opportunity to participate.

Hopefully, we can glean the information necessary for us to take the next step on this journey of understanding.

St. John's Sunday School Children and Youth



2006 SUMMER CAMPS

Here are some facts that you will need to know about summer camps.

- \$\frac{\psi}{2}\$ St. John's will pay half of the cost of the early registration fee.
- If you are planning on attending a camp, you need to do so as soon as possible. Some camps fill up quickly and you need to reserve your spot by sending in your application with your registration fee.
- Please let Mindy Dwyer know which camp you have signed up for so we can keep in touch with you through prayer and cards.
- A \$25 deposit must accompany registrations for all camps in order to hold your spot until May 15th. Reservations are not guaranteed until the full payment is received. Make checks payable to: Merom Conference Center.
- Only one registration per envelope will be accepted unless the registrations are from the same family and are for the same camp.
- Section 2 campers under age 18 must have the form signed by a parent or guardian.
- Camp fees must be postmarked AND paid in full before May 15th. Remember St. John's will pay half the cost of the early registration fee. Let Mindy know which camp you are going to so you won't miss the deadline!
- A camp will be cancelled if adequate leadership is not available, or if minimum registration is not met.
- Cancellations received more than three weeks before the first day of the event will be eligible for a refund of the actual registration fee paid, less the \$25 deposit. Cancellations received less than three weeks before the first day of the event will be eligible for a refund of 75% of the total registration fee. Beginning the first day of the event, no refund will be given.
