INTERNATIONAL ELECTRONIC WARFARE MANAGER (IEWM)

AIM OF COURSE

To train selected students in the principles and management of Electronic Warfare to enable them to provide Command advice on Anti-Ship Missile Defence (ASMD), Electronic Support Measure (ESM), Electronic Counter Measures(ECM) and Electronic Protective Measures (EPM) and to develop an appreciation of how threat based intelligence analysis is conducted. Students will also receive exposure to Task-Group and Unit level mission planning principles to enable them to support the Command in the production of a Maritime Tactical Estimate (MTE).
