


SAFEST PATH

SAFETY TIPS FOR WALKING IN THE DARK

In addition to the safety tips on page 22:

- Wear reflective clothing. Did you know reflective clothing is made of very tiny glass beads coated with metal? The tiny beads are half the size of a human hair and are glued to clothing materials to create a surface that reflects very brightly with any light that shines on it.
- Carry a flashlight with you. A flashlight or a headlamp can help illuminate your walking path and will keep you visible to drivers.
- Walk on the sidewalk facing traffic so you can see what the vehicles are doing.



DO YOU KNOW YOUR TRAFFIC SIGNS?

Street signs help both drivers and pedestrians stay safe on the road by providing guidance on what to do, what to expect ahead, and how to behave to stay safe. How well do you know some of the most popular street signs?

FIND THE OBJECTS


Intersections are places where roads cross each other or "intersect."

PUBLIC TRANSIT SAFETY

Did you know Phoenix is one of the largest cities in the United States?
Like most large cities, Phoenix has different transportation options like the light rail to help people reach many destinations.

Have you seen the light rail? Have you ever ridden the bus?

Do you know how to be safe near light rail tracks, stations, and bus stops?

- ▲ Wait in the Safe Zone. On the sidewalks, the Safe Zone is 3 big steps away from the curb. At the light rail station, the Safe Zone is behind the textured strip.
- Use the crosswalk to cross the street and the tracks.
- Wait for the train behind the textured strip.
- Never run after or next to a moving bus or train! Chances are another one will be by shortly.












WHAT IS A "HAWK"? HIGH INTENSITY ACTIVATED CROSSWALK

Is it a bird!? Not quite! It's just a special traffic signal to help people cross the road. Have you seen one?


