


Homo Sapiens Sapiens

Even though many hominids are interesting, the most fascinating is the Homo Sapiens Sapiens, or Doubly Wise Man, for three reasons. One, they were the first to migrate all of the continents. With their larger brains, and long slender bones they could walk longer distances. They were able to adapt to any weather, and build shelters, which helped them survive cold climates, while they were migrating. Homo Sapiens lived from 35,000 to 12,000 B.C.E. They traveled over land bridges to get to the other continents. Next, they were the most advanced tool-makers of all hominids. Some tools that they made were sewing needles, bow and arrows, hooks, spears, and



spear throwers. Once Homo Sapiens Sapiens had food and shelter, they had time to create art that expressed their feelings about the world. Through their artwork, early modern humans left behind a fascinating record of their lives. They left paintings



on the walls of their caves. These hominids also carved and shaped images out of clay, bone flint, and ivory. They even created musical instruments.
