
Key Vocabulary - compost, glass, metal, paper, plastic, recycling, reduce, reuse, repurpose

Foundational Text-

This week's foundational text is ***10 Things I Can Do To Help My World*** by Melanie Walsh. This book is about how young people can help the environment by doing simple things. Some ideas include not wasting paper, use both sides, turn off the lights, turn off the faucet, sort recycling.

Questions to ask your child after reading –



What were some things the girl did in the book? Why?

How can we help the Earth stay healthy?

What is recycling?

How can we recycle at home?

Does your family do any of the things listed in this book to help the Earth?

What is one new thing in this book you would like to try to do to help the Earth?

Activities you can try together –

Your child can sort out different recycling materials at home. They can identify which group is plastic, metal, cardboard, and paper.

Your child can use recycling materials to create an Earth invention. For example, a vacuum cleaner that cleans the Earth or a robot that sorts out recycling materials.

Your child can create a blueprint of their invention to gather their thoughts. They can label it with the invention.

R is for recycling. What other objects can you find that start with the letter r. Draw pictures of what you find.


Additional Books -
