



Engaging with the Media: Principles and practice

5 week online Short Course: 30 May - 29 Jun 2022

In times of information overload, misinformation and fake news it's becoming more challenging for scientists and journalists to engage meaningfully with a common goal to inform the public about research results and their implications for citizens. Researchers are often plagued with questions such as: How do I engage with the media? Who has the power to make decisions on stories? What is the journey of a news story? What goes into a media pitch? How should I prepare for an interview?

The Centre for Evidence-based Health Care, Department of Global Health, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Stellenbosch University, offers this 4 week online short course to provide researchers with a nuanced understanding of how to engage with the media in order to encourage the use of evidence in decision-making. Majority of the time will be spent intensely working with peers and facilitators to craft a well-designed and populated **media pitch** as well as get one on one coaching in **preparation for interviews with journalists**

28 hours total course time commitment over 5 weeks.
