
Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, CCRI offers more

Each year, Rhode Islanders fill more than 40,000 seats in our professional development, skill enhancement, job retraining and noncredit personal enrichment courses offered by CCRI's Center for Workforce and Community Education.

CCRI students are active participants in campus life and in the community. The college offers a varsity athletic program with sports and a diverse selection of student clubs and organizations, including student government. Annually, students, faculty and staff volunteer for a variety of Rhode Island nonprofit organizations, making life better for those less fortunate.

Since its inception, CCRI has graduated more than 68,000 students, with 95 percent of them living and working in Rhode Island. The college is the No. I provider of nurses and other health care workers in the state. Annually, more than I,000 CCRI students transfer to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island to continue their education.

CCRI's tuition is the most affordable in Rhode Island. A full-time student pays about half, or less, of tuition and fees charged at any other college in the state. ATHLETICS AT CCRI

AN OVERVIEW OF CCRI ATHLETICS PAST AND PRESENT

The Community College of Rhode Island is home to one of the Ocean State's finest and most successful intercollegiate athletic programs. Since its inception in 1965, the CCRI program has long been considered a front-runner in New England community college and junior college athletic circles.

The basketball, baseball, tennis, volleyball, cross country, golf and soccer teams have all been nationally ranked. The 2002 women's soccer team captured the school's first national championship, while a number of other squads, including men's basketball and women's soccer, were national runners-up. With nearly 5,500 victories, 222 All-Americans, I27 Region XXI championships and 828 All-Region selections, CCRI leads the way among all New England community colleges.

Great coaching has been the key to CCRI's success. From the athletic department's humble beginnings in 1965, the school has always featured legendary coaches. From Hall of Fame athletic director and men's basketball coach Vin Cullen to baseball coaches Ken Hopkins, Whitey Fell and Art Pontarelli, tennis coach Ray Carr and volleyball coach Gail Davis, the tradition of great coaches and top-flight teaching has extended through the years and continues through the present day.

The college holds membership in the National Junior College Athletic Association and is an associate member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

CCRI fields intercollegiate men's teams in baseball, basketball, soccer, cross country, indoor and outdoor track and golf and intercollegiate women's teams in volleyball, basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer and-softball. In addition to our intercollegiate sports CCRI offers four sports at the club level: men's volleyball, swimming, women's beach volleyball and eSports.

The Community College of Rhode Island has proven to be a steppingstone for many student athletes who have moved on to complete their academic and athletic careers at four-year colleges and universities throughout the nation.







2019 SEASON OUTLOOK

Solid pitching, strong defense, and consistent hitting will be the key to CCRI's success in 2019. After narrowly missing out on the playoffs last year, the Knights begin a new season with high expectations.

"This outstanding group of young men is a pleasure to watch compete on a daily basis," said second-year head coach Kevin Rix. "They work hard and play hard 100 percent of the time. Most importantly, they are a pleasure to coach."

CCRI kicks off its 2019 schedule at home against Johnson & Wales before a 10-game southern road trip at the RussMatt Invitational in central Florida.

The pitching staff is led by returning ace Zach D'Andrea (Warwick, R.I.), sophomore transfer Cristian Woods (East Providence, R.I.) and outstanding sophomore closer Kyle McCann (Coventry, R.I.) a 2018 All-Region XXI recipient. The Knights also welcome an outstanding freshman class led by Ben Sears (East Providence, R.I.), the 2018 R.I. Gatorade Player of the Year; Brett Traficante (Cranston, R.I.), a R.I. Interscholastic League First Team All-State selection; Reilly Beard (North Kingstown, R.I.); Dave Meech (Douglas, Mass.), a Massachusetts First Team All-State selection; and Pete Cohen (North Attleboro, Mass.). John DeRouin (Cranston, R.I.) from Cranston High School West, Kenrick Telemaco (Providence, R.I.) and Dariel Ramos (Providence, R.I.) round out a deep, diverse pitching staff.


The Knights will rely heavily on their two-way players as well, including sophomore **Zack Odsen** (Providence, R.I.), a 2018 All-Region XXI selection who plays both second base and pitches; sophomore **Joey Barter** (Coventry, R.I.), who will play first base

and pitch; fellow infielder and pitcher **Asa Nyblom** (South Kingston, R.I.); and **Marshall Quinley** (Cumberland, R.I.), who will play the outfield and pitch.

The Knights' strength is its outfield, led by returnees **Nick D'Ambra** (Coventry, R.I.) and **Jake Frost** (Cranston, R.I.), former All-State selections in Rhode Island, and outstanding freshman **Anthony Ramos** (Cranston, R.I.), an All-State selection in 2018. They'll be joined by Meech, a 2018 All-State selection with Oxford High School in Massachusetts; **Stewart Kay** (Bristol, R.I.) and **Marshall Quinley** (Cumberland, R.I.). Their ability to fly around the outfield and cover ample ground make them must-see players in 2019.

Odsen, one of the team's top two-way players, leads the infield at second base while Barter and Nyblom platoon at first. McCann and Sears share shortstop duties and **Ray Aponte** (East Providence, R.I.) gets the nod at third base with backup from utility infielders. **CJ Casalino** (Bristol, R.I.) and **Adrian Duran** (Providence, R.I.).

Justin Brown (Wallingford, CT) gets the majority of at-bats at designated hitter and the Knights also boast a trio of outstanding catchers in former All-Stater Alejandro Martinez (Cranston, R.I.), James Pedersen (Westerly, R.I.) and Paul Sorel (Pawtucket, R.I.), who played at Saint Raphael Academy.

Former Major League Baseball pitcher Rheal Cormier '88 is the only CCRI alumnus with his number retired. Cormier wore No. 20, which was officially retired in 2012.



The Knights have qualified for the NJCAA Division II World Series four times: 1988, 1992, 1996 and 2012.



Kevin Rix Head Coach



Kevin Rix returns in 2019 for his second season as head coach of the CCRI baseball team.

Rix made his head-coaching debut last year following seven seasons as an assistant and associate head coach. He earned his collegiate coaching stripes under the guidance of CCRI baseball's all-time wins leader, Ken Hopkins. Rix helped Hopkins win 175 of his record 411 collegiate victories during Hopkins' final seven seasons.

As an associate coach, he worked primarily with the Knights' pitchers and assisted in

other areas. Now as head coach, Rix has broadened his scope of duties to include offensive and defensive areas while still maintaining focus on his specialty, which is assisting the pitching staff.

Rix previously served as head coach of the Warwick-based team in Rhode Island's Connie Mack Baseball League and as assistant coach of the Warwick-based team in the Rhode Island Amateur League. In 2000, he was the assistant coach of the Pilgrim High School freshmen baseball team. He also served as an assistant coach for Warwick Veterans High School prior to his tenure at CCRI.

Rix lives in Warwick, R.I. He has a son, Kevin, and a daughter, Amanda.

Raymond Tessaglia Assistant Coach



Ray Tessaglia returns to CCRI with nearly two decades of experience at the amateur and Division I levels under his belt.

Nineteen years ago, he reunited with former head coach Ken Hopkins, with whom he assisted at Rhode Island College for many years with the women's basketball and baseball programs. Tessaglia is also the former head coach of the baseball team and former associate head coach of the women's basketball team at RIC. His

overall knowledge of the game and teaching skills, coupled with his familiarity working with Rix, benefit the CCRI baseball program.

Tessaglia lives in Providence, R.l., with his wife, Janice, and daughter, Sydney.

Joe Hopkins '81 Assistant Coach



Joe Hopkins played for the Knights from 1979 through 1981 and is now back for his third season as an assistant coach. As a catcher during his playing days at CCRI, Hopkins earned First and Second Team All-Region Honors.

Hopkins also has a wealth of coaching experience in both basketball and baseball. From 2012 to 2016, Hopkins coached in the George

Donnelly Sunset League in Newport and also served as the basketball coach for both Western Hills Middle School and the Cranston High School West freshman boys' team. SEASON SUMMARY

The CCRI baseball team had an up-and-down 2018 season, finishing with a 20-21 record, including 8-8 in Region XXI play.

The offense was led by sophomores Austin Davis (Hollywood, Fla.), Mike Castillo (Cranston, R.I.), Owen Wosleger (East Hampton, Conn.) and freshman Jarrad Grossguth (Coventry, R.I.).

A solid all-around player, Davis was particularly strong at the plate, where he finished with the 41st best batting average in the nation, a .420 clip that was also good enough to lead Region XXI. Davis drove in 37 runs, tied for second most in the region, and scored 24 runs. Defensively, Davis finished with a .951 fielding percentage, providing exceptional range in left field, and earned a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

Castillo finished with a .362 batting average and a .463 on-base percentage while leading the region with 15 stolen bases, a mark that also ranked 127th in the nation. Castillo also scored 23 runs and drove in 17 while adding three home runs and a total of seven extra base hits for a .563 slugging percentage. Joining Davis, Castillo won a Rawlings Gold Glove Award in center field with a .981 fielding percentage. Wosleger, also an outfielder, finished the season with a .340 batting average and a .438 on-base percentage. His 35 hits ranked third on the team.

At shortstop, Grossguth hit .319 with eight home runs, good for second in the region, and led the team with a .612 slugging percentage while scoring 34 runs with 36 RBI.

Staff ace Max Marcotte (Coventry, R.I.) finished 5-3 with a 4.06 ERA. His 63 strikeouts led the region and ranked him 86th nationwide. Fellow Coventry native and freshman Kyle McCann, also had a strong season, finishing 3-1 with the region's ninth-best ERA at 1.93. Fellow freshman Zach D'Andrea (Warwick, R.I.) capped an impressive rookie year with a 3.14 ERA in 10 appearances while leading the team with 51 2/3 innings pitched.

The season began in Florida, where the Knights finished 4-7, followed by a six-game winning streak to close out the month of March and put the team back above .500. A rough stretch in April set the stage for a season-ending series against regional rival UConn Avery Point. After losing three of their first four to the Pointers earlier in the season, the Knights lost the opener of the season-ending series, too, ending their hopes of qualifying for the district tournament. Davis, Grossguth, Marcotte, Castillo, McCann and freshman **Zach Odsen** (Providence, R.I.) earned 2018 Division II All-Region XXI Honors.

2019 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2019 CCRI softball team enters the season targeting a District K Tournament championship and a berth to the NJCAA Division III Softball National Championships.

Sophomores Hannah Caliri (Pawtucket, R.I.), Samantha Muller (North Stonington, Conn.) and Maddie McDonald (East Providence, R.I.) return as Tri-Captains in 2019. Each are committed to using their strong leadership skills and knowledge of the game to help guide the incoming freshmen and mold the 2019 tam into a cohesive unit that will overcome its toughest opponents.

Caliri serves as the ace of the pitching staff and also bats in the heart of the order. As a freshman, Caliri led CCRI with a 3.74 ERA and a 5-3 record, including 66 strikeouts in 58 innings pitched. She also finished with a team-high .393 batting average, including seven doubles, four home runs, 21 runs scored and 22 RBI.

After pitching 48 innings as a freshman, Muller will not pitch in 2019 due to injury, but will contribute offensively and defensively in a utility role. Last year, Muller led the team with a .435 batting average with five of her 20 hits going for extra bases.

McDonald plays center field and bats near the top of the lineup. She hit .293 as a freshman with six doubles, 24 runs and 14 RBI. Her speed at the top of the lineup creates runs while her athleticism in the field limits opportunities for the opponent.

Teaming up with the three sophomores is a bumper crop of talented incoming freshmen. Among them is Mackenzie Doyle (Glocester, R.I.), a former R.I. Interscholastic League All-Division outfielder and speedy slap-hitter who combines both assets to reach base as an effective leadoff hitter.

Another key freshman is third baseman Alexis LeBelle (Warwick, R.I.) another former RIIL All-Division infielder. LeBelle played

varsity all four years at Toll Gate High School and was a captain in her junior and senior seasons. Joining them is Hannah Northup (Warwick, R.I.) who also played baseball for seven years prior to softball, and splits time as a catcher and centerfielder.

Raevyn Watson (East Providence, R.I.) adds depth to the infield and Dayna Jackvony (Cumberland, R.I.) joins the rotation in addition to contributing offensively. Ariel Lopez (Woonsocket, R.I.), who played on the 2016 Woonsocket High School state championship team, is a strong, focused and extremely dedicated outfielder. Halley Ponitzman (Brentwood, Calif.) looks to secure a spot as a utility alongside potential first baseman Emily Coburn (Gloucester, R.I.), sister of former CCRI standout Elizabeth Coburn. Utility player Victoria Passaretti (East Greenwich, R.I.) is a quick, determined player with a positive attitude. Equally well-rounded freshmen Megan Ursini (Warwick, R.I.) and Lucy Vicente (Providence, R.I.), have the versatility and enthusiasm to help where needed.



DID YOU KN

The most prolific hitter in program history is Ashley Olson '12, who holds the school records for most hits in a season (62), most career hits (113), most career triples (8), most RBI in a season (62) and most career RBI (99). Olson went on to play for the University of Rhode Island.

Former pitcher Courtney Sheridan '17 owns all of CCRI's strikeout records, including career strikeouts (220), strikeouts in a season (148) and the school's single-game strikeout record (16).



Amanda Morse '05 set a new school record in 2004 with three grand slams in one game and remains one of two players in school history to hit three home runs in a single game. She is also the only CCRI athlete to earn All-American honors in softball and basketball.



COACHING STAFF

Kim Warrington Head Coach



Kim Warrington returns to CCRI for her third season as the Knights' head coach. In her first two seasons at the helm, Warrington led the Knights to a 22-24 record. Warrington arrived at CCRI in 2017 with a wealth of knowledge from her days as a player, coach and pitching instructor throughout Rhode Island, including one season as a volunteer assistant at CCRI under former head coach Bev Wiley in 2005.

From 2014 to 2016, Warrington served

as the head softball coach at Exeter-West Greenwich High School following a brief stint as a junior varsity and varsity volunteer assistant at North Kingstown High School. She also worked as the assistant softball coach at Roger Williams University in 2006 and 2007.

As a player, Warrington earned All-Little East Conference Honors each year at Rhode Island College and still holds the school record for career strikeouts (629) and innings pitched (632). She is also ranked second on RIC's all-time list with 17 career shutouts and third with a career 1.59 ERA, which translated into a successful career as a pitching instructor.

Warrington also thrived at the plate, finishing her career at RIC with the second most doubles in a single season with 15 in 2001.

The Rhode Island Association for Intercollegiate Athletics honored Warrington with its Distinguished Female Athlete Award in 2004. Warrington graduated cum laude from RIC with certifications in primary education and also a dual certification in special education (K-I2). She currently works as a special educator at Portsmouth High School and resides in North Kingstown, R.I.

Steven Day Assistant Coach



Steven Day comes to CCRI from the Rhode Island travel softball circuit, where he was the founder and president of the Rhode Island Aftershock Softball Program. With the Aftershock, he developed one of the area's top travel programs, including two state titles from the

fall of 2017 to the summer of 2018 and various invitational tournament championships throughout New England and the northeast region. He was not only responsible for coaching, but also involved with many other important facets in running a successful program, which included, but weren't limited to, working with the city of North Providence to renovate an old baseball field to be used for softball; negotiating team and individual training packages for the members of his programs with local fitness, training and hitting facilities in the area; and developing a fun, yet competitive, environment that helped him attract and maintain one of the most successful programs in the area.

Before working with the Aftershock, Day served as the varsity head coach at Johnston High School from 2013 to 2016, transforming a struggling, two-win program into a championship contender with a 12-8 record. He also served as a coach at North Providence Recreation from 2002 through 2011 in addition to working as the organization's Fast Pitch Director.

Coach Warrington sought out Day as an assistant due to his enthusiasm, heart, desire, love and dedication to his players and the sport of softball. Day developed a tremendously successful travel program throughout the years behind relentless efforts to build upon previous seasons while instilling a competitive nature. Day resides in North Providence, R.I.

Totals

Despite a 10-17 finish, the 2018 Knights showed improvement throughout the season and built a foundation for future success in the northeast.

The 2018 season began with a difficult, but important, road trip to Cocoa Beach, Fla., and ended with a wild, 11-10, loss to St. Cloud Tech, a back-and-forth game that summarized CCRI's entire season in a nutshell.

After returning from Florida, the Knights won their first game of the second in Game 2 of a doubleheader against Suffolk County College, which sparked a fourgame win streak that included a doubleheader sweep of Northern Essex in which the Knights outscored their opponent by a combined score of 68-1. In the Region XV/ XXI Tournament, the Knights faced perennial foes Orange County Community College from Middletown, N.Y., and Mercyhurst Northeast from North East, Pa., dropping back games and ending their season at 10-17.

Statistically, several Knights enjoyed milestone seasons. CCRI batted .313 as a team with a .387 on-base percentage. Standouts included **Hannah Caliri** (Pawtucket, R.I.), who led the team with 33 hits and batted .393 with four home runs. A major run-producer, Caliri scored 21 times and drove in 22. **Michelle Spremulli** (Warwick, R.I.) batted .385 with 30 hits, including four doubles and seven homeruns. Co-Captain **Kailee Morgan** (Charlestown, R.I.) batted .368 with 11 RBI and 14 runs and **Maddie McDonald** (East Providence, R.I.) finished third on the team with 26 hits, 14 RBI and 24 runs scored. **Sam Muller** (North Stonington, Conn.) surged late in the season led the team in hitting with a .435 batting average.

In the pitchers' circle, CCRI relied upon Caliri to lead the staff. She finished 5-3 with a team-leading 3.74 ERA and 66 strikeouts. Morgan worked 60 innings with a 4.67 ERA and 35 strikeouts while Muller added 40 strikeouts over 48 innings of work.

The Knights also played well defensively, highlighted by a strong outfield that covered ground at a major-league level. Typically a centerfielder, McDonald held down left field in 2018 and prevented a handful of runs with diving catches. Team MVP **Stevie-Ray Wood** (Compton, R.I.), a consummate team player, anchored the team's outfield defense, consistently robbing opponents of extra base hits with her exceptional range.

At their best, the Knights were a force to be reckoned with in 2018 and always gave a full effort both on the practice field and on game day. The final record was deceiving considering the team improved as the season progressed and played its best during the stretch run.


