Day 1 Should Your Town Ban the Sale of Plastic Water Bottles?

Americans are in love with bottled water. Back in the 1970s, your grandparents drank water that came straight from the faucet. Today, the average American drinks at least one plastic bottle of water every day.

Why Has Bottled Water Become So Popular?

Bottled water has become popular for several reasons. Some say it is about taste. But in taste tests around the country, people often can't tell the difference between bottled water and tap water.

Others say it is about purity. They

believe that water in a plastic bottle is cleaner. However, tap water in many big cities, like New York and San Francisco, is actually cleaner than much bottled water.

A third reason why water bottles have become popular is convenience. When a kid's mom packs her lunch, it's so simple to put a plastic bottle of water in the lunchbox.

Why Are Plastic Water Bottles a Problem?

The popularity of bottled water has created a problem across the United States and around the world. That problem is water-bottle trash. It is quite easy to **recycle** plastic water bottles, but many people don't do it. Bottles that are put in trash cans often end up in **landfills**.



What Can Be Done?

A few cities have decided to take action. In 2013, Concord, Massachusetts, became the first American city to **ban** the sale of small plastic water bottles. As of 2019, more than 100 American cities have placed some

limits on selling plastic bottled water. But many towns and cities have done nothing.
