



The following adaptive recreation programs are designed for individuals with developmental and/or physical disabilities.

Therapeutic Recreation

Through our various programs and events, we focus on what is known as therapeutic recreation which extends beyond short-lived activities and works to stimulate physical, cognitive, emotional, social and leisure development through consistent activity so that individuals may participate fully and independently in chosen life pursuits. Recreational therapy, provided by qualified professionals known as Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialists (CTRS), is extremely individualized to each person by the participant's interests and lifestyle.

Appropriate for participants with Down Syndrome, autism, ADHD, other learning and developmental disabilities. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to participate. Ages 12+

The Roswell Area Park Pool is a 50-meter Olympic-size pool with eight lap lanes, a diving well with two spring boards, and a children's wading pool with spray feature. The entire family has an opportunity to enjoy many programs at the pool, including aquatic exercise programs, swim lessons, lap swimming, swim team, dive team, and more! Season Swim Passes

As a season pass holder, you will receive daily admission to the pool, and an exclusive Pass Holder's Party held during the summer. Passes are available for individuals and families.

Adult Swim Team/Adult Fitness Swimming

Coaches will group swimmers by level of ability. Current or former competitive swimming experience is not required. Roswell Rapids Swim Team

This award-winning team offers a comprehensive program of instruction and training for competitive swimmers. Swimmers will be grouped by age and train according to their abilities. Roswell Rapids Dive Team

American Red Cross Lifeguard Review Course

This course is designed to review the lifeguarding skills and core knowledge required to recertify in lifeguarding. Class is roughly 20 hours of instruction. Prerequisite: Current Red Cross Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED or Shallow Water Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED Certificate. *Note:* If certificate is expired, participants must take the full Lifeguarding or Shallow Water Lifeguarding course. Ages 15+

American Red Cross Lifeguard Certification

Earn the American Red Cross Lifeguard Certification upon completion of this blended class offering both online and in-person sessions. Class is roughly 25 hrs of instruction. **Prerequisites:** Candidates must be able to swim 300 yards continuously using front crawl and breaststroke. Candidates must be able to swim 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7-10 feet, retrieve a 10 pound brick from the bottom of the pool, and then swim 20 yards carrying the brick. All candidates are required to complete 7 hours of online video training prior to the start of class. Candidates will be tested on online training the first day of class. Must be 15 years of age or older on the first day of class.

Certification Requirements: Attend all class sessions, successfully perform all required skills, successfully complete three final skill scenarios, pass the written exam with a grade of 80% or better on each section. Lifeguard Training/First Aid/CPR/AED is valid for two years. Ages: 15+



Long-standing cornerstones of historic Roswell, 'A Southern Trilogy': Roswell's Historic House Museums consists of Barrington Hall, Bulloch Hall, and Smith Plantation. These houses provide a sense of community "rootedness" and endurance, as well as an opening for tourism and connection. They represent our past but are also a place of reflection, dialogue, and decision as we move forward. In collaboration with the efforts of the Roswell Convention and Visitors Bureau, our historic assets draw tourism from almost all fifty states and several countries around the world. The staff and volunteers of Roswell's historic sites are proud to serve the community and hope to see you soon.

Barrington Hall (ca. 1842)

535 Barrington Drive

Learn what started it all through the King family, instrumental in establishing a successful textile mill along Vickery Creek and the development of Roswell. Also home to the oldest antebellum garden in the Atlanta-metro area open to the public, Barrington Hall highlights the significance of historic preservation and land-scape to the Roswell community.

Bulloch Hall (ca. 1839)

180 Bulloch Avenue

Discover a Presidential link in one of Roswell's founding families. Built for the James Stephens Bulloch family, this antebellum home on the Georgia frontier shaped the life of Mittie Bulloch, mother to Theodore Roosevelt, 26th President of the United States.

Smith Plantation (ca. 1845)

935 Alpharetta Street

All that remains of an original 300 acre farm, the Smith Plantation story reveals a snapshot of Roswell history through the years. Discover a walk through time as you enjoy a tour of the house and property, learning of antebellum Roswell to the 1950s, understanding how each generation left its mark.

Mimosa Hall & Gardens Update

127 Bulloch Avenue

A beautiful Greek Revival house surrounded by gardens, Mimosa Hall is an inspiring monument of survival. The home's first owners, the Dunwoody family, named it "Phoenix Hall" when its walls were rebuilt in 1844 after a devastating fire. It was later the home of A.J. Hansell, who moved to Roswell after the Civil War to rebuild the burned Roswell Mill. The Hansell family named the house Mimosa Hall after the lovely trees on the property. In the early twentieth century, Mimosa Hall was the final home of renowned architect Neel Reid, who integrated the antebellum mimosa trees and other historic plants into his grand landscaping masterpiece of the gardens surrounding the house. The property was acquired by the City of Roswell in 2017 and is currently under development for the

community. The grounds are available for rental and visitation through appointment only. For more information, please call 770-641-3954 or email us at rrpd@roswellgov.com.

Staff are hard at work to address further planning and site development. Efforts have been underway to address key safety issues on the grounds as well as making progress towards opening the house for the public. The first phase of accomplishing a Certificate of Occupancy was funded and completed in September 2020. Much needed refurbishment of the Neel Reid era reflection pond was completed by working with a brick mason that specializes in period methods and reproductions.



Our Art Centers believe everyone is an artist. We strive to offer prorgamming in a variety of disciplines for all levels, age groups, abilities and interests.

Art Center West 1355 Woodstock Rd., Roswell, GA 30075

Surrounded by acres of beautiful parkland sits a white house on a hill that has become a playground for the artistic soul. Art Center West, a community ceramic arts studio, offers a variety of adult and youth classes for anyone wanting to add creativity and imagination into their lives. If you are new to clay or a seasoned expert looking for an inspirational location to continue your learning experience, ACW has a class or workshop waiting for you.

Handbuilding classes are offered for students from beginner to advanced learners. Beginning courses guide students through basic forming techniques including pinch, coil and slab construction, as well as a variety of surface and finishing options. More advanced courses, such as figurative sculpture and mixed media, explore both human and animal forms.

Wheel throwing classes are offered for the beginner to advanced learner. Novice students learn to wedge clay and use the potter's wheel to center and throw basic forms such as mugs, bowls and vases. Advanced students learn more complicated forms and refine their technical skills on the wheel while exploring more surface design options.

Unique **firing classes** enable participants to experiment with alternative techniques, including raku, saggar, soda, and wood firings.

Youth wheel classes are available to kids as young as 8 years old and include classes that combine wheel throwing and handbuilding or wheel throwing and recreational tree climbing.

Clay classes are offered weekdays, evenings, and Saturdays. Additionally, open studio hours allow adult students to use the studio to practice their skills in a friendly and peer-supported environment.

Throughout the year, ACW also hosts several workshops conducted by visiting artists. These workshops



help expand the knowledge and skill-set students have acquired in and out of the class and build their personal connections within the ceramic art world.

The Forge at Art Center West

Tucked just behind Art Center West in Leita Thompson Park, this specialized facility offers blacksmithing, knife making, and welding classes for participants ages 16 and older. The Forge is a relatively new addition to our programming and is quickly growing in popularity.

Your experience in our forging classes will be an instructional journey through tools and equipment, material selection, body mechanics, design considerations, forging techniques, basic heat treating principles and finishing methods. You will experience a very active class with an emphasis on hands-on learning with hammer, heat, and iron.

Our **Blacksmithing** programs are intensive classes that serve as introductions to forging arts and are focused on project-based learning, including ornamental and functional iron works.



Bladesmithing participants will gain crucial forge and finish experiences and will leave the course with a finished, heat treated knife. The foundational courses are designed to be built upon during future exploration and coursework, including adding knife handles, advanced finishing and heat treating, and forging Damascus blades.



Welding courses offer an excellent way for beginners to learn how to join pieces of metal through different types of welding. This course will offer an overview of MIG, Stick, Oxyacetylene, and TIG processes while emphasizing sound welds with sufficient penetration. These "crash courses" have been designed to give participants the knowledge and confidence needed to start working safely with these fun metal joining processes.

Whether at the anvil or fabrication table, our knowledgeable, motivated, and inspirational instructors use a combination of lecture and hands-on training in our outdoor facility. No need to be intimidated if you have never worked with metal before – our staff welcomes all participants, no matter your level of experience. 
Evelyn Breit


